

Christmas shopping opportunities abound

There are more Christmas markets and craft fairs than ever this December.

New for 2008 is the **Cologne Christmas Market** on the South Bank between Waterloo Bridge and the London Eye. The deputy mayor of Cologne came to London specially for the opening ceremony last month.

Southwark Council budget cuts mean that there's no Bankside Frost Fair this year so Better Bankside has stepped into the breach with the **Bankside Winter Festival** including a craft market outside Tate Modern from Friday 12 to Sunday 21 December. The festival begins with a lantern parade.

The **Christmas Pyramid**, selling a variety of German seasonal delicacies, will be in Potters Fields Park next to Tower Bridge from Wednesday 3 to Tuesday 23 December.


Away from the river there are many opportunities to seek out unusual gifts. For the second year the University of the Arts London is staging a **Winter Market** at the London College of Communication to allow students and alumni of its six colleges to sell their products.

The independent shops of **Bermondsey Street** have joined forces to offer a late-night shopping event with special discounts on Thursday 4 December.

The Menier Gallery on Southwark Street hosts its annual **Craft & Design Fair** to include jewellery, ceramics, homeware, prints and more. The fair supports the work of the charity Paintings in Hospitals which runs the gallery. •See listings for the events mentioned above on page 3.

New Year Fireworks at London Eye

Mayor of London Boris Johnson has confirmed that he will follow the tradition established by his predecessor and stage a New Year fireworks display at the London Eye on the South Bank.

Renowned pyrotechnician Christophe Berthonneau will once again light up the sky around the London Eye for the display which will be broadcast live on BBC One.

"I can think of no better city to spend New Year's Eve and these fireworks will remind Britain and the world of the joys and charms of this city all year round," says Boris Johnson.

Viewing space along the Thames is severely limited. For those able to able to get into the viewing areas, there will be specially mixed soundtrack from BBC Radio 1 as they wait for the fireworks at midnight.



BOOK REVIEW

London: The Illustrated History

This book is stamped with the new Museum of London logo which appears in different colours for the main museum, Docklands and Archaeology.



The museum was established in 1976 as a successor to the London Museum in Kensington Palace. This history of the capital by heads of department at the Museum of London treat Lambeth and Southwark as part of central

London. Such recognition would not have happened thirty years ago when much of Roman Southwark had yet to be uncovered. Now the official history shows how, against the odds, an insignificant river crossing became the British capital. London Bridge is the heart of London.

This book is profusely illustrated with pictures on every page. Information is sometimes provided on new maps such as the position of 45 inns in Borough High Street in 1550. Over two pages there is a 1798 painting of logs and straw being taken to the City across Blackfriars Bridge.

Featured is the Rhinebeck Panorama which is soon to be displayed at the Museum of London. This shows Southwark and the City waterside from a balloon just downstream of London Bridge in 1810. Another picture shows the 1861 Great Fire of Tooley Street from the north bank. Other double pages are devoted to the Globe theatre and the 1951 Festival of Britain.

Surprises indicating the importance of Southwark include the fact that Henry VIII established a Royal Armoury at Southwark staffed by Italians and, during Charles II's reign, the Court of Admiralty met on the site of the Slug & Lettuce in Borough High Street.

The cover shows a 1572 map of Borough, Bankside and Upper Ground but this does not mean that the entire book is devoted to Lambeth and Southwark.

The book is divided up by area so Londoners can follow a trail and the sections on Southwark have interesting new material. The author, whose recent book *The English Year* has a frost fair cover, is willing to explode myths including exotic suggestions for the origin of St Mary Overy. The cathedral's name just means 'over the river'.

Roud has a new theory for the word 'stew' which referred to the rooms of Bankside prostitutes. He claims it means "heated bath house'. The Cardinal's Hat pub, which was a stew, apparently did not have a hanging sign but one painted on the front to be seen from the City.

There is an interesting quote from John Stow about the stews which includes a reference to a prostitutes' burial place called the Single Women's Churchyard. This may be what we now call Crossbones in Redcross Way.

At nearby Bear Gardens Samuel Pepys finds bull and dog baiting "a very rude and nasty pleasure" and fifteen years later John Evelyn calls it a "rude and dirty pastime".

The author, who had access to the Folklore Society archives, claims that Bermondsey was one of the very few places in 1930 to still be celebrating May Day with May pole dancing. This custom has now been revived in Red Cross Garden.

Illustrations in this facinating and worthwhile book include the Lambeth Pedlar, Southwark Fair and Doggett's Coat and Badge Race.
