London Bridge Festival

A new arts festival launches this month around London Bridge.

The festival runs from 10 to 25 July and offers two weeks of theatre, comedy and poetry by new and established acts.

The start of the festival coincides with the London Bridge Anniversary Fair on Saturday 11 July which marks 800 years since the opening of the original stone river crossing. See page 3.

Headline comedians at the festival include Marcus Brigstocke, Stephen K Amos, Brendon Burns and Funny Women Awards winners Suzy Bennet and Andi Osho allowing Londoners to catch them before they go to Edinburgh.

There will be music at the Contemporary Urban Centre, poetry at the Golden Hinde, comedy for kids at Pizza Express and much more.

The festival is hosting four competitions and there's still time to get involved.

The 48 hours short film competition asks directors, crew, actors and writers to make a film in two days. They'll be given a title and genre by the festival organisers on 10 July with the challenge of writing, shooting, editing and submitting a short film on 12 July at the Roxy Bar and Screen.

The photography competition

takes two defining features of London life as its theme: glamour and grime. Entries are needed by noon on 17 July. Daily Telegraph photojournalist Kate Day will judge and the three winners get to go to the festival wrap party.

People can also enter short stories on the themes of glamour and grime to the festival's writing competition. Shortlisted entries will be read at a special event at the Old Operating Theatre. Deadline is noon on 17 July.

New and recently established comedy acts can enter the best new comedy awards to win cash and a professional gig at the Up the Arts Comedy Club.


