An annual event held in the Bankside area by The Lions part. It is a celebration of the New Year, mixing ancient seasonal customs with contemporary festivity. To herald the celebration, the extraordinary Holly Man, the Winter guise of the Green Man from pagan myths and folklore, decked in fantastic green garb and evergreen foliage, appears from the River Thames brought by the Thames Cutter, Master Shipbroker (boat subject to weather!). With the crowd, led by the Bankside Mummers, the Holly Man 'brings in the green' and 'wassails' or toasts the people green' and 'wassails' or toasts the people and the River Thames - an old tradition encouraging good growth. The Globe is wassailed in like fashion. The Mummers then process to the Bankside Pier, and perform the traditional 'freestyle' Folk Combat Play of St. George, featuring the Turkey Sniper, Clever Legs, the Old 'Oss and many others, dressed in their spectacular 'guizes'. The play is full of wild verse and boisterous action, a time-honoured part of the season recorded honoured part of the season recorded from the Crusades. Cakes distributed at the end of the play have a bean and a pea hidden in two of them. Those who find them are hailed King and Queen for the day and crowned with ceremony. They then lead the people through the streets to the George Inn in Borough High Street for a fine warming up with Storytelling, the Kissing Wishing Tree and

The London Poverty Map

Charles Booth Old House Books • £12.99

This is an 1889 street map of central London.

Every street is colour coded according to wealth by Charles Booth who was assisted in his famous poverty investigations by his relative Beatrice Webb. She knew the Tower Bridge area well. Booth himself sometimes stayed in lodgings with deprived families.

Yellow stands for 'the servant keeping class' but the only yellow building in SE1 is Lambeth Palace.

Red is 'well-to-do middle class' and can be found down both sides of Blackfriars Road and in Nelson Square. But just behind is Pocock Street marked deep black for 'lowest class, vicious, semi-criminal'.

The middle classes seem to line the main roads. even Dockhead and the Elephant & Castle are red whilst Butler's Wharf and Bermondsey have black spots.

However, Roupell Street is by this time already 'fairly comfortable'.

My Ward

This is the story of St Thomas', Guy's and the Evelina Children's Hospitals and their ward names.

The author is Wendy Mathews who has devoted all her adult life to St Thomas' Hospital as a nurse, physiotherapist and founder member of the Friends of the Florence Nightingale Museum. With over 50 years experience of three hospitals and a husband also at St Thomas' she is well placed to write this book.

She suggests that St Thomas' dates from 1106 and took its present name in 1173, just three years after St Thomas Becket had been murdered. She is rightly firm about the correct position of the apostrophe. She is also clear and concise on the history of both Guy's and Evelina.

The earliest ward name seems to have been Noah's Ark which was reached by outside stairs. In 1593 there were Abraham, Isaac and Jacob Wards. 1696 was an important landmark as this was the year when patients got their own bed and sharing was abolished.

At St Thomas' today there is Doulton Ward which is named after Henry Doulton who nearby made the hospital's much admired nursery rhyme tiles. Scutari Ward recalls Florence Nightingale's Crimea days.

Guy's still has local boy Charles Dickens giving his name to a ward but Keats Ward, named after medical student turned poet John Keats, has closed. Wendy's history reveals that for a very short period there was Talbot Ward which consisted of beds in the former Tabard Inn known to Chaucer.

This is a very good value paperback full of new and interesting information.

BOOK REVIEW

A Murder on London Bridge

Susan Gregory has produced one of her Thomas Chaloner mysteries set largely around London Bridge in the year 1664. It is wooden, lined by houses and crowded with cows, geese, sheep, pigs and horses.

Charles II has been back in London for just four years following the fall of the Cromwell regime. Indeed the King's entry into the capital was by way of Borough High Street and London Bridge. He had come up from Dover with General Monck who knew Southwark well. The 350th anniversary of that event is next year.

Chaloner is a spy on the fringes of court life with access to Whitehall. His girlfriend is a lady in waiting to the Queen and his wanderings take him not only on to London Bridge but upstream along both sides of the river.

He drinks at the Dog & Duck in St George's Fields and at the Beggar's Bush in the Paris Garden where the pastime is rat racing. There is early action with a sword fight in Southwark Cathedral.

It's a convincing story and doubt does not creep in until after 150 pages when Tom goes to a Roman Catholic mass in the evening. This is a surprise as mass always had to be celebrated before noon until Pius XII's reign in the 20th century. Was evening mass allowed in 17th-century England due to the priest shortage?

Since Susanna Gregory is really, under her real name, a Cambridge academic I think we should be told.
