Celebrate the

Royal Wedding in SE1

A round-up of royal weddingrelated activities in SE1 as Prince William and Catherine Middleton prepare to marry at Westminster Abbey on Friday 29 April.

Southbank Centre is hosting a **London in Love** weekend to mark the start of the Festival of Britain anniversary celebrations throughout the summer. The programme includes live dance and music events across the site, including a Guilty Pleasures club night (Saturday) and a Big Busk (Saturday - see page 3) and gig (Monday) by Billy Bragg. Visitors will be able to watch the wedding of the decade at Southbank Centre and at The Magners Pasture, Udderbelly's beer garden, and there will be an opportunity for 12 couples to get married in Southbank Centre's Chapel of Love. The Hayward Gallery's Project Space is showing an exhibition (see page 7) that focuses on contemporary artists' representations of the House of Windsor, while the first Real Street Food Festival (see page 3) will take place on Southbank Centre Square.

The **EDF Energy London Eye** will have Union Jack bunting and the wheel's lights will turn red,

white and blue on the evening of the wedding. From the moment the royal couple make their vows in Westminster Abbey, the London Eye is offering two complimentary tickets to all married couples called Will and Kate who turn up at the wheel (with their wedding certificates) during the following week.

Less tastefully the **London Dungeon** is offering a free miniature ball and chain to the first 100 couples to visit the Tooley Street attraction on royal wedding day.

easyJet is searching for Europe's best Will and Kate look-a-likes and will be holding the grand final of its competition in **Potters Fields Park** on Wednesday 27 April. The top 10 Will and Kate look-a-likes will each win a trip to London to enjoy the celebrations and be in with a chance to be crowned the best double and receive free easyJet flights for a year. Details at *ilooklikearoyal.com*

Road closures on the wedding day will include **Lambeth Bridge** and **Westminster Bridge**, with knock-on effects on buses and other traffic in SE1.

The police's public order operation will be run from the control room in **Lambeth Road**. **St Thomas' Hospital** will have a New Year's Eve-style security operation to deal with the extra crowds around the building and the challenges posed by the road closures.

We haven't heard of any planned street parties in SE1 but the **Setchell Estate Tenants' & Residents' Association** in Bermondsey will be celebrating the wedding along with St George's Day on Saturday 23 April; see page 3.

SE1 will also feature in the television coverage of the wedding: Anna Botting from **Sky News** will be hosting a live screening event on the South Bank for public figures, friends of the royal couple, charities and other opinion formers.

Waterloo Bar and Grill will be serving a Royal High Tea with a selection of sandwiches, cakes and teas for £30. Guests can choose from the special wedding cocktail menu available throughout the day). Other local restaurants offering special menus include the Oxo Tower.

Anti-monarchy campaign group Republic will be holding its **Love Republic** party at the Borough Bar in London Bridge Street to conclude a day of "not the royal wedding" events. There will be a schedule of live bands, comedy and surprises. Details at *www.republic.org.uk*

The City of London Corporation has launched an annual competition for a member of the public to win the opportunity to take the controls of Tower Bridge, stop the traffic and raise the bascules for a boat to pass through.

The 'guest bridge driver' will be supervised by a senior technical officer, who will guide him or her through the procedure, which involves making a series of public announcements and using a joystick and a sequence of buttons to close, unlock, raise, lower, lock and reopen the bridge.

Afterwards, he or she will be presented with a commemorative certificate in the control cabin, before being offered a tour of the Tower Bridge Exhibition, as well as the chance to visit the underground bascule chamber and the fifth-level turrets, neither of which are open to the public. As they leave Tower Bridge, they will be given a bottle of champagne.

Applicants can enter the prize draw by answering a question about Tower Bridge or the Square Mile on the bridge's website. The answer can be found by visiting the Tower Bridge Exhibition or by exploring the bridge's website at www.towerbridge.org.uk

The winner will be chosen by selecting a random number from the total number of entries emailed to entries@towerbridge.org.uk

Lord Mayor of London Michael Bear will make the first draw this month.

"It may take around eight minutes to perform a bridge lift, but the competition winners' memory of taking the controls of this historic landmark will last a lifetime," says bridge master Eric Sutherns MBE.

"As well as being a privilege, you feel a real sense of responsibility. The controls in your hands are lifting over 2,000 tonnes of Victorian ironwork and bringing part of the city's traffic to a standstill.

"I hope that people will enjoy entering the prize draw, and my colleagues and I look forward to welcoming the lucky winners and their guests to the control room for their briefing and bridge lift."
