The last Mayor of Southwark?

HILARY WINES could be the last 'civic' Mayor of Southwark.

If a borough-wide referendum in the New Year records a majority for a directly elected American-style executive mayor then Hilary Wines will be the last person to hold the historic office of civic Mayor of Southwark. The line of office holders can be traced back to the 19th century when the original small London boroughs were created.

The opposition Liberal and Conservative Parties at the Town Hall will be opposing the change which has yet to win enthusiastic support from all Labour Party members. However, Minister for London Nick Raynsford has ordered the local referendum which will be

held on Thursday 31 January. Although this referendum could bring in a major constitutional change for Southwark there is concern on all sides that the average turnout in other towns and cities holding similar polls has been less than 20%.

 Another surprise announcement is Hilary Wines' decision to leave the Council when her mayoral term ends in mid-May. She has served as the high profile member for Cathedral Ward for 16 years and the news has shocked her fellow Liberal Democrat members and Bankside residents. Cllr Wines immediate plans include a holiday and a lengthy visit to Gibraltar where she has family connections.

Sainsbury's planning return to SE1

THERE IS the possibility of a larger than expected Sainsbury's supermarket opening in Stamford Street.

Sainsbury's chief executive Sir Peter Davis says that he is considering moving the entire headquarters staff back to Stamford Street once the new building designed by Lord Foster is complete on the old site. The original plan had been to let the new building and leave the Sainsbury's HQ staff

at Holborn.

The new supermarket alongside the Holborn office is proving so popular that administrative staff have had to be banned from shopping at lunchtimes. The supermarket opening in Stamford Street early in 2005 may now have to be large enough to accommodate growing demand as well as the needs of staff who in the past enjoyed use of an in-house staff shop.

Bankside stables "ugly" - developers

THE MUSSETT stables building in Hopton Street is "unsightly" say the promoters of the proposed thirty-two storey replacement tower block.

London Town's stresses that the existing building had been "deemed to be unworthy of listing" by English Heritage but confirmed that a photographic record had been made and that is archaeological there investigation provision. Developers concede that a new building would "interrupt views for some residents". London Town will set up a liaison committee to work with nearby residents during the building work.

Open Spaces Trust premises threat

BANKSIDE OPEN Spaces Trust has found its premises named as a possible development site for the Elephant & Castle regeneration programme.

The Trust could be made homeless to make way for temporary housing for Elephant & Castle residents. This has come as a shock to the Trust which moved onto the Library Street site near St George's Circus six months ago at the invitation of Southwark Council with funding from both the Council and Elephant Links. The popular pioneering Open Spaces Trust looks after nine Bankside parks and open spaces.

Starbucks make an impact on Bankside

STARBUCKS HAS opened two more coffee shops on Bankside in addition to the first opposite Shakespeare's Globe. The large Starbucks in the existing Winchester Wharf building in Clink Street opened its doors quietly last month. There are plenty of comfortable chairs but the river can only be seen by those who stand up to see through the high windows. Meanwhile a smaller Starbucks coffee shop has opened in the former hairdressers at Falcon Point despite a dispute over planning consent. Residents above the shop are expressing concern about noise from the outside tables next summer.

AFTER 18 years research Judy Harris's Roupells of Lambeth has at last been published. Richard Palmer Roupell was the wealthy landowner who developed Waterloo's Roupell which Street has survived as an important residential road. It has also become a popular ready-made set having featured in numerous films from Upstairs Downstairs to Dr Who as well as fashion shoots. The author's work was inspired by her local history classes tutored by Brian Bloice at Morley College. The story culminates with the rise and fall of William Roupell, MP for Lambeth from 1857 to 1862, who squandered the family fortune.
