Bridge 'can carry elephants' – official

AT 10.03am the Millennium Bridge re-opened as 91 year old Emma Drake stepped on to the £23m structure holding the arm of Town Crier Peter Moore just in case it wobbled.

For last month's bridge opening there were 160 people queuing on Bankside to walk across to the City and meet Southwark Mayor Hilary Wines walking south with Corporation of London 'Leader' Judith Mayhew. Soon Southwark's Met Police were in the middle greeting their City colleagues who usually patrol Thames bridges.

The City's three police horses on duty remained in the shadow of St

Paul's although the designers' spokesperson claimed that the world's first lengthy lateral suspension bridge can now take elephants.

Arrivals on the City side were given St Paul's Cathedral leaflets whilst Bankside visitors received money-off vouchers for Shakespeare's Globe Exhibition.

The Sun's Page Three girl had little luck wobbling jelly and Bridge architect Norman Foster declared that he would jump off the bridge if it wobbled again. The Millennium Bridge Trust insisted that if "a 4,000 ton ship crashed into it at 12 knots it wouldn't budge".

Troubled times for SE1 restaurants

NEAT HAS closed. The bar, brasserie and restaurant planted on Oxo Tower Wharf from Cannes failed to open its doors on a Monday morning after a weekend of normal trading. The tables remain laid and there is an open bottle on the bar but Neat is now in voluntary liquidation. Closure comes as a surprise since Neat's bar snacks and meals were beginning to attract new customers. Richard Neat is well-known as the only Englishman to have gained a Michelin star on French soil. However, Harden's 2001 restaurant guide reported "aggressive prices for cooking that didn't quite deliver" and "a setting whose only real plus was its river views".

Meanwhile, full-year pre-tax profits at the SE1-based Fish! chain have fallen to £1.7 m from £2.2. According to Chairman Tony Allan lunchtime trade has been down at the original Fish! restaurant in Borough Market. He also reports "noticeable effects in evening trade" at both the Borough and the County Hall branches.

"Whilst trading remains difficult the Fish! brand remains robust" claims the chairman. Fish! opened 11 new restaurants across the UK last year bringing the current total to 18. The company, the first restaurant group in the world to display the Marine Stewardship Council logo on its menu, says it is also expanding its knowledge of environmentally-friendly fishing methods.

In Bermondsey Street Fred Dickieson has announced a revamp for the Honest Cabbage following adverse reports on the once popular restaurant. Having been away, running the short-lived Honest Goose in The Cut, Dickieson says that he is taking back the Honest Cabbage to make it again a 'local' restaurant in the rapidly changing Bermondsey Square area.

Producer Lisa Hazlehurst says: "We've been wandering around just getting to know people and getting to know the geography. It's enormous!" Patients only appear in the programme if they wish and filming is only in areas where staff are happy for it to go ahead. The series will run until Easter.

Mayor slams London Bridge Tower plan

MAYOR OF LONDON Ken Livingstone is asking for improvements to the public areas around a 300 metre high tower proposed for London Bridge Station and calling for more details on the scheme's benefits including community amenities and affordable housing. He is also seeking a multi-million pound package for a new bus station and tube improvements as conditions for approval. London Bridge Tower, which will be Europe's tallest building, has been referred to the Mayor for Stage One comment before being considered by Southwark Council this month.

GLA brings 560 staff to More London

THE GREATER London Authority is moving its 560 strong workforce from Westminster to the riverside City Hall in July. The Foster designed glass building will be opened by the Queen. Plans are advanced for the opening of the next door Ernst & Young 24 hour headquarters with over 3000 workers. The Pool of London Partnership forecasts that by 2010 at least 30,000 people will be working on the More London development between Hay's Galleria and Potters Field. A supermarket will open there in 2004 when the Unicorn Children's Theatre is also due to move to Tooley Street.

Ken Livingstone will be on the South Bank on Tuesday 12 March for the opening of Iroko Housing Co-operative. This latest Coin Street development, designed by Haworth Tomkins Architects, is opposite LWT and has been long known as the 'old car park'. Residents, including children, have been settling in to the 59 new homes since last year.

ROYAL OAK

The Royal Oak in Tabard Street has won its way through to the final of the Evening Standard Pub of the Year shortlist. The Market Porter lost out in the judging and Baltic in Blackfriars Road has also dropped off the Best Bars list leaving SE1 with no entries in the Bar awards. The Royal Oak is up against just four London pubs including Fleet Street's Cheshire Cheese.

103 WATERLOO ROAD

In an attempt to reduce confusion many Waterloo initiatives have moved to 103 Waterloo Road. At the refurbished office block are the South Bank Partnership, South Bank Employers' Group, Waterloo Project Board and Waterloo Community Regeneration Trust. Also at the address are other Single Regeneration Budget projects.

More Southwark History

THE POPULARITY of SE1 can be gauged by the flow of new books. Surprisingly Southwark Past by Richard Tames (Historical Publications £15.95) does have new information as well as plenty of illustrations and old maps. This is a book about old north Southwark rather than the new London borough. It is also the first book to recognise that the Shelley circle, normally associated Hampstead, lived for a time south of the river. Early feminist Mary Wollstonecraft lodged in Dolben Street and her son-in-law Percy B Shelley in Nelson Square. Pictures include John Bunvan's weatherboarded meeting house in Zoar Street.

exhibition review

ndy Warhol at **Tate Modern**

IMAGES MAPPING the creative output of Warhol are at Tate Modern. Paintings, films, photos and sculptures show Warhol going beyond his 15 minutes of fame and entering the canon of art history. Using images from magazines and comic books he redirected methodology of art practice and conventions of art, drawing heavily from the immediacy of the photographic image. Sinister images of electric chairs coated in pastel shades restructure meaning and establishes Warhol as a supreme colourist. Warhol as the doyen of Pop Art is never in dispute. This show pinpoints his celebrity, creativity and remarkable way of viewing and stands as a document of American culture.

NOISE IS a very real problem in SE1. Building roadworks, sites. proliferating bars and restaurants that stay open till late, the inevitable background music, 24 hour shops, endless car traffic - you name it we've got it in triplicate. Southwark Council runs a 24 hour Noise Patrol, but they do have to witness the noise. Being driven crazy by an all-night party feels bad enough, but to then have to await the arrival two burly environmental health officers at 3am can be daunting. An alternative excellent the Southwark Mediation Service which acts as an independent mediator between yourself and the offender. Mediation has a 90% success rate and over 60% of the service is spent dealing with noise problems! The downside is that because of funding cuts the service is only open to Council tenants and some referrals from the police. Your community police officer can also be helpful. Many of my friends envy me living in such an interesting area. Yes we do have some lovely things on offer but no amount of fancy bars and art galleries can make up for the very real suffering created by noise. It feels well past the time that some of the money being poured into SE1 for regeneration and community schemes was allocated Mediation and Environmental Health Services. Public health and good community relations are surely more important than fancy pavements and signage.
