Sainsbury's not returning to Stamford Street

RECENT MEDIA reports suggest that Sainsbury's has scrapped plans to return to the Southwark site where it was based for more than a century.

At the end of last year the company moved 2,600 staff from its long-established head office in Stamford Street to the site of the former *Daily Mirror* HQ at Holborn Circus.

The supermarket giant had previously signalled that it was thinking of returning to Southwark once its former main building had been rebuilt.

Sainsbury's is to redevelop Rennie House and Wakefield House sites with a sale price of £41m. Also

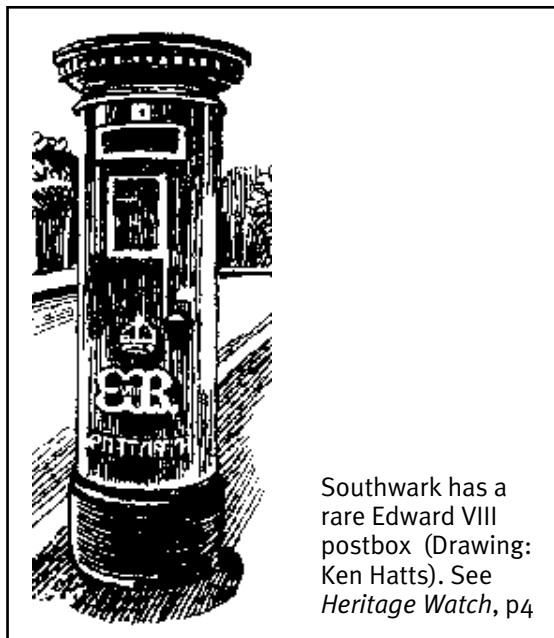
up for sale is its building in Blackfriars Road occupied by BT.

Already food packaging has ceased to carry the familiar Stamford Street SE1 address.

The first member of the Sainsbury family to work in Stamford street was a hatter and until a few years ago Sainsbury's allowed the former hat factory, now the Mad Hatter hotel, to be used by community organisations and charities at low rent.

However, the company has confirmed that a Sainsbury's Central supermarket will open on the corner of Stamford and Rennie Streets in December 2004.

...and Express to leave Blackfriars?

EXPRESS NEWSPAPERS could leave Blackfriars Road according to speculation by worried staff.

Journalists at riverside Ludgate House fear that most of the departments are to be moved to Broughton in Lancashire where the new *Daily Star Sunday* production team is based. Remaining staff could then be accommodated at the company's Northern & Shell magazine office in Docklands.

Owner Richard Desmond has applied for planning permission to build an extra floor on top of the

Broughton office which already houses 300 people.

Journalists on the *Daily Express*, the *Sunday Express* and the *Daily Star* discussed the possible changes at emergency National Union of Journalists meetings.

Rumours have persisted that Desmond was looking to leave Ludgate House, where Northern & Shell remains a tenant of former Express owner Lord Hollick. Reports have suggested Holborn as a possible new location for Desmond's London operation.

'Tate Tower' rejected by Southwark Council

A PLAN TO build a 20-storey block of flats in Hopton Street next to Tate Modern has been rejected by Southwark Council.

Among those at the planning committee meeting was Tate Director Sir Nick Serota who likened the plan to building a tower block in the British Museum forecourt. The site was until recently a 19th-century stables occupied by a paper merchant.

The surprise decision, supported by six of the seven councillors, has delighted residents of Falcon Point and Bankside Lofts who returned from the Town Hall to a celebration at the Founders Arms.

The rejected proposal was the second for the site after the initial 32-storey plan was turned down earlier this year.

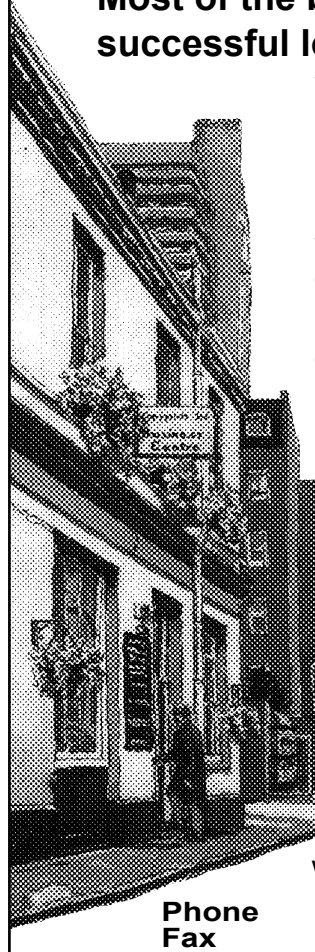

MOMI not to reopen on South Bank

THE AWARD-WINNING Museum of the Moving Image (MOMI) will not reopen. The £15m museum opened in 1988 but 'temporarily' closed in 1999 for refurbishment. It was due to reopen this year but the British Film Institute has now announced that the building will house the BFI library.

Former BFI Director Anthony Smith says: "It's a great betrayal...an appalling and unacceptable decision." Exhibits included Marilyn Monroe's shimmering dress.

However, a spokesperson for the BFI says: "Parts of the collection" would be shown in free changing displays in the new BFI complex.

Congestion charge web page for SE1

A WEB page dedicated to the Congestion Charge in SE1 has been launched by Southwark Council.

Council Environment spokesperson Cllr Richard Thomas says: "Lots of people are worried about congestion charging. The website lays out in concise form what the scheme might potentially mean to Southwark residents."

There is information about initiatives being considered by the Council. The Congestion Charge will operate from February next year.

Meanwhile Labour's Nicky Gavron has promised to support the charge if elected Mayor in 2004.

Armed French police on duty at Waterloo

ARMED FRENCH police are on duty at Waterloo International enforcing immigration controls. It is thought to be the first time foreign police have been stationed in the UK.

The trained border police can challenge anyone whose documents do not satisfy them and refuse them permission to board the Eurostar train for France.

A reciprocal agreement allows British immigration officers to check passengers travelling to Britain from Eurostar platforms at the Gare du Nord in Paris, Calais and Lille. The scheme is to be extended to Belgium in a bid to cut the number of illegal immigrants using the Channel tunnel to enter Britain.

Borough Market walkway plan

A HIGH level walkway above Borough Market and an extension of the riverside path behind Winchester Wharf are among the options outlined in the Draft London Bridge Planning Framework.

The core area includes Southwark Cathedral and the London Bridge transport interchange. The pedestrian link would be attached to the railway viaduct to link with Cannon Street Bridge.

Responses to the document, jointly issued by Southwark Council, the GLA and Transport for London, should be sent to the Council by Wednesday 20 November.

**Wolf Game at the
Union Theatre**

WOLF GAME at the Union Theatre combines ideas of Native American culture and the fast paced life-style of the American Northeast to produce a coming of age play about a boy's struggle for identity. Teen rebelliousness, a mother's actions (and their consequences) and denial all come into account in this new play by Sarah Diamond. Daniel Hart's portrayal of lead character Mike is amazing – he captures the heart, and, more importantly, the soul of a sixteen year old boy. The emotion and life put into the character is gripping and heart wrenching. The cast makes excellent use of the innovative stage space and seem completely comfortable on the set, with each other, and with the audience.

Consignia'd to history**

THERE HAS been a subtle moving of post boxes in SE1 recently. The one outside the Young Vic front door has been moved east with its old site hardly marked in the pavement. The handy double postbox outside the language school in Roupell Street suddenly moved to Hatfields to take account of the one-way system. So it is good to learn that English Heritage has come to an agreement with Royal Mail to preserve the old red boxes. Southwark has two rare Edward VIII post boxes. The King only reigned from January to December 1936 and so only a few were made. Indeed some were even changed when he suddenly abdicated just before Christmas. In London there are just 17.

Kapoor's Marsyas at Tate Modern

ANISH KAPOOR'S gigantic *Marsyas* is the third in the Unilever Series for Tate Modern. This enormous sculpture, the largest in the world, is housed in the impressive Turbine Hall. It is three steel rings joined together by a single span of red PVC with huge projecting funnels looking like trumpet lilies or some massive theme park construction and alluding to its classical reference of a satyr flayed alive by the god Apollo. *Marsyas* has been likened to flayed skin by its creator. With light travelling through its three interconnecting funnels it cannot be perceived in one single glance. The structure touches the dimensions of the hall and is a wonder to the mind and eyes.

New secret garden in SE1 green revolution

A QUIET revolution is taking place in SE1 – we already have the excellent Bankside Open Spaces Trust, the much-loved Waterloo Millennium Green plus plans for the transformation of Emma Cons Gardens. Now a garden group of tenants at the Peabody Estate in Duchy Street is creating what is in effect a secret garden that has astonished visitors this summer with its beauty in what was once a rather grey and dismal environment. Two years ago the Peabody Trust refurbished the estate as part of the Millennium celebrations. Residents on the estate then felt the need to create their own planting schemes and gardening began almost spontaneously. One of the founder members of the group, Anya Darr, said that at first they had to clear concrete and rubble left behind by builders. Then as one person began gardening others followed suit. There are now ten permanent members of the Riverside Green Scheme as the group now calls itself and also regular planting days for the whole estate. Anya also reports that since the gardening started there is “a greater sense of ‘connectedness’ and neighbourliness” on the estate and many more birds and butterflies than previously. Next year a woodland area is to be planted and Anya hopes the group will ultimately be a resource for other estates locally. If this inspiring example does catch on then we really will have a green revolution in SE1 – and one that will bring hope and happiness to many local people.

•Meanwhile the Museum of Garden History in SE1 has launched an appeal for £500,000 to refurbish its interior.
