London Festival of Architecture


The London Festival of Architecture builds on the success of the London Architecture Biennale held in 2006 (remember those sheep being driven across the Millennium Bridge?) with an even bigger programme of events.

The festival started on 20 June and runs until 20 July with the focus turning to each of the festival's five hubs in turn. The Southwark & South Bank Hub will come to the fore between Wednesday 9 and Sunday 13 July with installations, exhibitions, talks, tours, walks, films and performances organised by the Architecture Foundation.

Allies & Morrison architects on Southwark Street are hosting an exhibition called *London South Central: Future Developments in South Bank and Southwark* (page 6) showcasing major projects at Waterloo, Blackfriars Road, London Bridge and Elephant & Castle. An accompanying evening debate on Wednesday 9 July will focus on the future of the Elephant & Castle.

The Southwark Lido (pictured; see page 3) is a temporary installation on a vacant site in Union Street by French collective EXYZT providing a meeting and bathing space. The lido will host a variety of activities in an unusual environment.

The LFA brings together the cultural institutions along the south bank of the Thames for late night openings on the evening of Friday 11 July from The Hayward to the Design Museum (page 3). On the same evening parkour and skater films will be shown in the undercroft of the Queen



Elizabeth Hall which the Southbank Centre wants to reclaim for a new foyer. More than 4,000 people signed a petition to the Prime Minister calling for the retention of 'Skate City' and Boris Johnson described the potential loss of the skating space as "a great shame".

In Jubilee Gardens former RIBA president Jack Pringle is launching a bid to return the Festival of Britain Skylon to the South Bank (page 7).

The Urban Street Hunt - a photographic treasure hunt - on Saturday 12 July encourages the public to discover hidden spaces around SE1.

Bop to Architecture is a mobile installation coming to Shad Thames (Friday 11), Great Suffolk Street (Saturday 12) and Flat Iron Square (Sunday 13). During the afternoon visitors are invited to enjoy refreshments and listen to of audio samples recorded in Southwark's streets. In the evening the installation becomes a dance floor and party venue.

There is also an installation by artist Scott King on the hoardings at the abandoned 'Tate Tower' building site next to Tate Modern on Hopton Street,. With an arresting graphic style King, a former art director at i-D and Sleazenation magazines, plays with the notion of the temporary structure, subverting its original purpose.

Look out for a giant wardrobe by artist Simon Fujiwara under the railway arches at the Union Gallery, Ewer Street (page 7).

The festival includes an extensive programme of bike tours led by architects and experts arranged in association with Southwark Cyclists. The full programme is shown on the website.

BOOK REVIEW

The Greater London History & Heritage Handbook

Peter Marcan Publications • £25

It is nine years since the last edition of this handbook which was described then as "an indispensible reference tool".

This latest version is not just an update but a rewrite. It is extraordinary that almost a decade on this book carries information not easily found, if there at all, on the web.

Those living in SE1 will find questions many would like to ask are answered such as: what is the difference between BRF and BOST? Waterloo residents will at last find an explanation of WCDG and WGT. And what is Better Bankside? Also, if Potters Fields Park is not run by the council how do you contact the park management?

Much of the large paperback, which has around 1,250 entries, is divided into London council areas but the Elephant & Castle has its own dedicated section. Those interested in planning applications will be pleased to find such useful information as contact and membership numbers for the Thorney Island Society which is objecting to proposed South Bank skyscrapers spoiling the view from Westminster.


