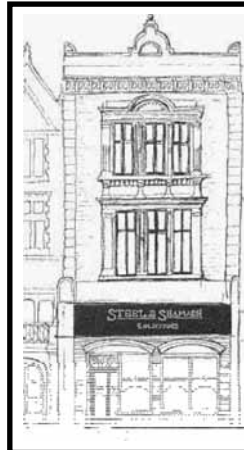

Chelsea garden at Oxo Tower

A Chelsea Flower Show show garden is coming to Oxo Tower Wharf this month.

On the South Bank it will be 'remixed' into four garden installations by four new designers in the same way that a song would be remixed by different producers.

It will then be taken to the RHS London Shades of Autumn show for a fifth version before finally completing its lifecycle, with materials donated to local community gardens.

The Remix Garden installations will run from early August until the end of October. Each garden will be in situ for three weeks. The installations will be designed by Anoushka Feiler, Daniel Lobb, Matthew Childs and Jon Sims.

Conceived by Cityscapes director and landscape designer Darryl Moore, a former DJ, musician and producer, the project draws a parallel between garden design and music culture www.cityscapes.org.uk
