## The National unveils development plan

Backstage facilities slammed by star • Powercut leaves theatre dark

**THE NATIONAL** Theatre's Lyttelton Theatre is to be split into two in a radical new plan to attract younger audiences to the country's premier theatrical institution.

The result will be the Lyttelton Arena, a 650-seat in-the-round space in which all audience members will be required literally to cross the stage to reach their seats and in which no one will be more than 25 feet from the actors themselves. The second venue will be an intimate 100 seat Lyttelton Loft.

Both spaces are firmly aimed at attracting non-conventional theatre audiences as well as young, up and coming writers and directors who have shied away from producing work for the National's larger theatres. There will also be an Internet café and a barbecue area as well as a bar with reasonable prices and a late drinking licence. The Lyttelton productions will also have much cheaper tickets, ranging from £8 to £18 compared to £10 to £32 for normal NT productions.

NT artistic director Trevor Nunn said: "The National has been most emphatically defined by its building – we have been challenged and

sometimes trapped by it."

Nevertheless, Nunn was at pains to point out that it was an experiment and only a temporary transformation. At the end of six months, the Lyttelton will be returned to its current proscenium arch form to house a revival of one of the 20th century's greatest stage classics – Tennessee Williams' *A Streetcar Named Desire*, starring Glenn Close.

Hoping for even further change and refurbishment at the National Theatre is Dame Diana Rigg who claims that the dressing rooms are so dreadful that she feels cross every time she enters the building.

Meanwhile the National had to postpone the first preview of the controversial Mother Clap's Molly House when a transformer exploded causing a power cut.

### Old Vic launches appeal

**AT THE** Old Vic Joan Plowright is heading a fund-raising campaign to enable essential repair work on the building to go ahead. The theatre is offering the chance to purchase and dedicate a seat in the theatre. Those coming forward include Anthony Hopkins and Kevin Spacey.

## Tate Tower: opposition grows

**THE CONTROVERSIAL** 32-storey tower planned next to Tate Modern would "improve the public realm both for visitors to the area and for local residents" claim the developers. The planning application for the proposed £55m building, taller than the Tate's landmark chimney, is now with Southwark Council. "The new Hopton Street building will provide a significant architectural statement which underlines London's position as a leading world city" says Peter Harris of the developers London Town. However, the newly formed Bankside Residents Against Tate Tower (BRATT), who were surprised to find the plans lodged during the August holiday period, has called a meeting to oppose the application. Spokesperson Theresa Towle says that the tower would "ruin the whole amphitheatre effect of the present buildings around the Tate entrance".

Commenting on its acquisition of the site in Holland Street, London Town Chief Executive Jonathan Buchanan said: "I am delighted that we have secured this prime site."

- The meeting for those interested in developments in the area, including the Tate Tower site, will be held at 7pm on Tuesday 4 September in Tate Modern.
- The future of Southwark Street's giant St Christopher House will be discussed at the Hotel Mercure opposite on Tuesday 11 September from 6-8pm. Architects and developers will be present to receive feedback from residents prior to a public exhibition next month.

### New bridge to link Bankside with city

THE PROPOSED pedestrian bridge attached to Cannon Street railway bridge has been given the go-ahead by Mayor of London Ken Livingstone. The covered bridge, which will be on the upstream side and equipped with observation towers, meets the aims and objectives of the Mayor's Spatial Development and Transport Strategies by promoting walking in London and encouraging public access along and across the river. "I'm delighted to give my support to this exciting new structure" says the Mayor. Project founder Bill Higgins says that there is no need to build into the river.

### Hotel planned for St George's Circus

AN EIGHT-STOREY Travelodge hotel is planned the north-east corner of St George's Circus alongside Library Street. But concern is being expressed by the St George's Circus Group which has successfully campaigned to save the Georgian terraces opposite. "We want all who care about the environment to write to Southwark Council opposing this development" says Ian Anderson from the Group. "If it is allowed to go ahead much of the achievement of the last year will be negated as the building will turn the northern half of the Circus into a canyon."

### Facelift for Lower Marsh Market

LAMBETH COUNCIL is to give Lower Marsh Market a much-needed tidy-up. The Street Care division is taking action to deal with eyesores such as derelict stalls and illegal fly-tipping. The strategy includes removing broken stalls left on the street and causing obstruction. Street Care agent Shane Clarke says: "Traders have been informed that abandoned stalls, and those which have not been cleared away at the end of the day, will be removed. We will be inspecting the market every evening at 6pm to check that stalls have not been unnecessarily left on the street."

### SE1 Snippets

#### PRIORY IN BOROUGH

A branch of the famous Priory clinic has opened in St Thomas Street. Depressed celebrities tend to go to the west London clinic but Keats House is expecting to see plenty of office staff. The new clinic takes its name from poet John Keats who was a local medical student until he decided that the solution to his depression was a career change to poetry.

#### SHIP MISSING

HMS President is still missing from the mooring opposite the Oxo Tower. Although the ship left in early August for a refit in Hull she is to be found in West India Dock. The Port of London Authority is not expecting her to return to Blackfriars until late autumn. Meanwhile Inter Action, the charity based on board, is operating from the tower of St John's Waterloo.

#### CAR FREE DAY

Two Thames bridges are closing for Car Free Day on Saturday 22 September. Tower Bridge will host special events. Also closing is Southwark Bridge. Nearby Great Guildford Street will be the venue for the launch of a car club scheme which will provide a pool of cars for the use of local residents who do not wish to maintain a car of their own.

#### BATTLE OF WATERLOO ROAD

An American TV company is trying to get in touch with older residents who were interviewed or photographed in 1941 for *Battle of Waterloo Road* book. ### Footprint London Handbook

FOOTPRINT'S NEW *London Handbook* by Charlie Godfrey-Faussett (£10.99) naturally includes two substantial sections on SE1, covering Bankside & Southwark and South Bank & Waterloo respectively. Tate Modern justifiably gets several pages, and a good range of the smaller attractions are also covered. There are some sloppy mistakes in this guide, such as the misspelling of Purdy Hicks Gallery, the inclusion of County Hall's defunct FA Premier League Hall of Fame and Clink Street's Backspace Internet provider which closed more than a year ago. Coverage of food and drink is good, though: it includes hidden restaurants like Gambia Street's Catalan Mar i Terra. Transport information is patchy, but they do mention in SE1's sister *London SE1* website in the *Directory* section. A comprehensive and competent guide to London, but not the best on the market.

**Hamlet at the

**"WHO'S THERE?"** With no pause for interval, Peter Brook's production throws off the outer machinations of court and country, to better distil from Hamlet himself the sorrows of human deceit. The soliloquies themselves are distillations of a mind circling on self's needs and what life makes necessary and Brook's editing may obsess us further but Adrian Lester's Hamlet is immaculately poised to the task. Scott Handy as Horatio is a gracious facilitator and Jeffrey Kisson richly provocative as the usurper posed by uncle and spectral father alike. An oriental musician tunes action and atmosphere in a multi-racial cast and, in a zen-like circle, the final moment closes to a beginning.
