The Hidden Church

St Alphege stood at the south end of Lancaster Street from 1882 to just over a century later. The site, on the south-eastern corner of the King James Street crossroads, is now flats. The original Anglican red brick aisleless building was a well-known Anglo-Catholic shrine drawing people from all over London. Its curates included the late Percy Coleman. The easily missed new church is in King's Bench Street, round the corner from the former clergy house. The building, most visited when used as a polling station, has furniture from the old building. The Sunday service is at 9.30am except on the 4th Sunday of the month when there is a handy mass the night before at 7pm -Saturday night for Sunday •T 0171 407 2796
