**Millennium  
Candle lit  
by Bishop**

The Millennium Candle is now burning in Southwark Cathedral and will be in place until the end of the century. The Jubilee 2000 Candle, as it is officially known, is set in a rock encircled by a heavy chain and intended as a focus for prayer for those around the world who are enslaved by debt.

At the lighting ceremony, which was marking the 50th anniversary of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, Bishop Tom Butler said: "If to us the Declaration seems blindingly obvious, to many millions around the globe it is a dream to pursue, a dream made all the harder by the chains of debt."

A photographic exhibition celebrating the Declaration is at the Tom Blau Gallery in Queen Elizabeth Street (see page 5). Visitors have included Helena Kennedy and Kate Adie.

**South Bank goes from  
strength to strength**

"The South Bank goes from strength to strength" says Melvyn Bragg. "This is shaping up as one of the great areas of London."

The South Bank Show presenter was commenting on the £200,000 art and architecture competition to create a South Bank Gateway on the main pedestrian route from Waterloo Station to the South Bank's arts venues. The project has the support of Shell International who own the land and

funding will come from the National Lottery.

Artists and architects are being invited to collaborate in the creation of a permanent work of art which will be a distinctive beacon for visitors at the 50 metre long Sutton Walk. A public exhibition of the shortlisted proposals is planned.

September will see the opening of the Shakespeare's Globe Exhibition beneath the Globe. This will be a permanent exhibition and the biggest of its

kind devoted to the world of Shakespeare since Elizabethan times. It will be the completion of Sam Wanamaker's dream as the Inigo Jones theatre in New Globe Walk, now housing a temporary exhibition, is released for winter productions.

Also opening in 1999 is the wine world experience Vinopolis, with an entrance in Clink Street, and the IMAX cinema at Waterloo. The Jubilee Gardens reopen in November.

**Book Review**

**Visions of Southwark**

This book is described as being "about the terror and beauty, the boredom and stimulation, the dread and excitement of life in inner city South of the Thames". There are delightful pictures of familiar Victorian buildings when new — Keats House in St Thomas Street, the Hop Exchange and brick warehouses along Southwark Street. More recent wood engravings show such places as London Bridge station in 1949. Bankside is seen with cranes and the building of the Globe. There is an unusually good bibliography and notes on artists. *Visions of Southwark* (Peter Marcan Publications; £9.95) is available from selected bookshops including Southwark Cathedral bookshop and the Riverside Bookshop.

The Mad Hatter, which has been open for almost a year, is not only a pub but a hotel with 30 bedrooms as well as a restaurant. The building was once a hat factory (hence Hatfields nearby) where the process drove the workers mad. Now the frontage has been adapted to look like an old fashioned hotel where Dickens would be at home. He would appreciate the food which includes home-made broccoli soup with chunky bread (£2.30), Top Hat Pie (£5.75) and Toad-in-the-Hole (£4.95). Not so hot on puddings which include Banoffee Pie.

This may be the beginning of a tradition. Magnificent indoor music is in abundance at the South Bank Centre. Nearby St John's Waterloo has a special concert by the London Festival Orchestra in aid of the Make A Wish Foundation. The BBC Symphony Chorus is singing at Southwark Cathedral in aid of the Children's Society. Meanwhile the regular free lunchtime concerts continue - St John's even has one on Wednesday 30 December.

When Pope John-Paul II visited Southwark one pottery produced mugs bearing a view of the riverside Southwark Cathedral. However the Pope's visit was to St George's Cathedral opposite the Imperial War Museum. It's confusing for tourists. Indeed St George's was a cathedral before the ancient St Saviour's in The Borough was made into the Anglican cathedral. The Roman Catholic Cathedral of St George was an impressive Pugin building, dating from 1841, until bombed in the Second World War. But there are traces of the original inside as well as a window depicting the Pope's historic visit. The main Sunday Mass is at 11.30am. (Children's Mass at 10am)
