Month of festivals

September is a packed month of free outdoor events and festivals from the banks of the Thames to Elephant and Castle.

The annual **Oyster & Seafood Fair** at Hay's Galleria (Friday 7 to Sunday 9 September; see page 3) offers cooking demonstrations and live entertainment.

Previously the **Great River Race** has coincided with the Thames Festival but this year it takes place a week earlier on Saturday 8 September (see page 3). The annual 22-mile race of traditional human-powered craft is always a spectacle to behold.

On Friday 14 September the river around the Millennium Bridge at Tate Modern will be the setting for the UK premiere of American composer Alvin Curran's **Maritime Rites** (see page 3).

Anyone with time on their hands over the weekend of Saturday 15 and Sunday 16 September is spoilt for choice. **The Mayor's Thames Festival** is always a highlight of the year. As well as the familiar stalls, music, carnival and fireworks, look out for the **Feast on the Bridge** to be held on Southwark Bridge on Saturday with a huge array of delicious foods. And on Saturday night **Maudits Sonnants** in Jubilee Gardens is worth checking out. Turn to page 8 for an at-a-glance guide to what's happening during the weekend.

As usual the Thames Festival coincides with **Open House London** which provides an opportunity to visit buildings of architectural interest not normally open to the public. Turn to page 8 for a complete list of participating SE1 buildings.

A new addition to the calendar is the **Bermondsey Street Festival** to be held in and around Tanner Street Park on Saturday 15 September (see page 3). Organised by the Bermondsey Street Area Partnership, the event aims to celebrate the creativity of the Bermondsey community.

Elefest is the Elephant & Castle's annual cultural festival (22-30 September). This year's lineup includes musical events at the Coronet Theatre, free film screenings at the London College of Communication and - new for this year - open-air film screenings in Elephant Road Park and Iliffe Yard.

Neighbourhood centre opens its doors




The Coin Street neighbourhood centre in Stamford Street opens its doors this month.

The building will provide a permanent home for Coin Street Community Builders' family, youth and children's programmes – including a 64-place nursery – currently based at 99a Upper Ground, as well as new offices for Coin Street staff. Support for local small businesses and social enterprises will also be provided.

Later in the year a neighbourhood cafe with outdoor terrace, restaurant and food shop will open on the ground floor.

The top floor offers conference and meeting room facilities for business and community use.

BOOK REVIEW

Regeneration and Renewal

The church in new and changing communities

Edited by Malcolm Torry • Canterbury Press • £14.99
Buy this book online at www.inSE1.co.uk/books**Malcolm Torry, who as a curate worked at the Elephant & Castle and Bankside, has edited this book on regeneration as seen from the resident's window rather than the developer's brochure.**

Whilst he has moved on to minister to the Dome and Greenwich's eco Millennium Village he clearly sees SE1 as being the focus of most change.

Contributors include Tim Scott who is both rector of Christ Church Blackfriars Road and the Bishop of Southwark's regeneration adviser. His own parish includes Palestra, the Beetham Tower and Tate Modern.

Also writing are Giles Goddard, until this year Southwark's area dean, Waterloo rector Richard Truss and Elephant & Castle rector Neil McKinnon. Southwark's former council leader Jeremy Fraser raises the difficult issue of continued unemployment despite renewal.

Richard Truss, who includes wonderful stories about Peter Hall and Marianne Faithful in his church, reminds us that the two oldest Waterloo buildings are the Old Vic and St John's. The population has doubled since the 1990s and he thinks one of the tasks at St John's is to abolish the barrier between what is regarded as sacred and what is seen as secular or profane.

Neil McKinnon writes that "the sacred is to be found within the secular". Like Jeremy Fraser he is able to give a useful account of the first years of change. The rector, having been appointed to the twelfth most deprived parish in the Southwark Diocese, wonders if it could be the twelfth richest when he leaves.

Christ Church has an extraordinary reredos depicting a Manhattan church dwarfed by skyscrapers. This may be more relevant than we think for although New York churches once benefitted from real estate deals there is now emerging a downside as residents are squeezed out by change.

This is a book for those who wish to have informed dialogue with developers rather than do nothing.

On his barge Curran will be joined by a group of improvising musicians including Evan Parker on the Saxophone and Melvyn Poore on the Tuba. Outside Tate Modern the London Symphony Orchestra Brass will be playing Curran's re-composition of music historically associated with the Thames written specifically for this UK premiere. The UBS Orchestra will perform from the Millennium Bridge, leading volunteers with their instruments. The performance will last 75 minutes and finish at 7pm.

BOOK REVIEW

God's Architect: Pugin and the building of romantic Britain

Rosemary Hill has written an impressive book about the architect Augustus Pugin who is famous for giving us the gothic-inspired interior of the Houses of Parliament. It confirms that in addition he was responsible for the Palace's exterior outline and Big Ben.

He also gave the Scottish capital a great landmark in the form of the Tolbooth St John's spire. This had been intended for St George's Cathedral in Southwark.

Fr Thomas Doyle's negotiations for Pugin to get the Southwark contract took place not in London but at Alton Towers, home of Lord Shrewsbury whose body was later to lie in state at the cathedral. In 1848 three thousand people attended the cathedral opening when the bishop preached a one and a half hour sermon.

That year Pugin lived at Walworth House, near East Street Market, and it was from there that he set out for his wedding at St George's. His bride was Jane Knill who he called his "a first rate gothic woman".

St George's was not his only Southwark building. A less successful work was the Dockhead convent which, like the cathedral, was almost entirely destroyed by Second World War bombing.

Pugin's own gothic house was at Ramsgate but his last days were spent at the Imperial War Museum which was then Bedlam, an asylum for those thought to be insane. His favourite builder George Myers lived nearby in St George's Road and his last act on his own death was to cancel the long outstanding bill for his work on St George's Cathedral.

Pugin's frenetic life and work cannot all be fitted into this 500 page book but the important moments are here along with the 19th-century background.
