Switched On London

The capital's festival of light returns to the Pool of London and Bankside this month from 7 to 14 February.

Held for the first time last year, the 2008 festival aims to demonstrate that light in an urban environment can be achieved energy efficiently and stress the importance of lighting from a social, economic and environmental perspective.

Key landmarks such as the Tower of London, Tower Bridge, London Bridge, HMS Belfast and Southwark Cathedral will boast new lighting designs for the duration of the festival.

This year the installations have spread inland from the river to include the London Bridge

Post Office and the car park at the north end of Bermondsey Street. In Borough High Street pedestrians passing Maya House will trigger changes in the lighting as they walk past hidden laser beams.

Potters Fields Park will also feature special light effects including 'breathing trees' and poetry projected on to the paths. A Garden of Light will remain in the park beyond the end of the festival

There will be around fifteen lighting projects in total; full details at www.switchedonlondon.com

The team will provide realistic alternatives to the wasteful and inefficient schemes that currently operate in London and cities worldwide.

"I fully support the Switched on London 2008 campaign and will be making sure that City Hall takes part in the event again this year," says Mayor

of London Ken Livingstone.

"Switched on London is to be commended for their campaign to promote the use of energy efficient lighting in London at night. By using more efficient lighting, organisations and households can save money and help to tackle climate change."

All the 2008 schemes will be audited for their energy usage and where an existing lighting scheme is replaced, offer comparative data of how the alternative scheme provided better lighting whilst utilising less energy. A good example of this from the 2007 festival was the Tower of London's scheme which dramatically lowered the building's power consumption.

The festival is sponsored by Better Bankside and Southwark Street-based Fagerhult Lighting.

NEW ATTRACTION

The Movieum of London

This month the Movieum, an interactive exhibition dedicated to the British film industry, opens at County Hall on the South Bank.

It promises to tell their story of how movies are made and where to find the locations of famous shots. In addition to history of Pinewood and Elstree there will be sections on special effects, animatronics, make up and wardrobe.

Also part of the Movieum experience is the British Animation Exhibit which includes Thomas the Tank Engine and Bob the Builder.

The Movieum is the latest venture of Jonathan Sands whose Weird & Wonderful company – originally a movie prop hire business based at Elstree – was behind last year's Star Wars exhibition and the ongoing Fright Club attraction at County Hall.

London has been without a film museum since the British Film Institute closed the Museum of the Moving Image in 1999. The BFI is planning to build a new national film centre on the South Bank, probably on the controversial Hungerford car park site next to Jubilee Gardens.

BOOK REVIEW

Fighting Fundamentalism: A Spiritual Autobiography

Douglas Bartles-Smith • Saxty Press • £12
On sale at Southwark Cathedral Shop

Douglas Bartles-Smith retired in 2004 after 19 years as Archdeacon of Southwark. *Fighting Fundamentalism* is his autobiography where he reveals what he did before Southwark.

First he explains the origin of his name. His dentist father added the hyphen to avoid being confused with another dentist called Smith who had been involved in scandal.

Douglas has known SE1 since the Sixties when as a curate he used to visit Bermondsey pubs having been banned by his vicar from being seen drinking in his Westminster parish. His years as a Southwark resident feature such figures as Bill Skelly and Mervyn Stockwood. There he discovered that the main character in David Hare's play *Racing Demon* was based on the Rector of Lambeth. He also confirms that Rowan Williams nearly became Bishop of Southwark.

Douglas Bartles-Smith writes about the unsuccessful campaign to save the Church Commissioners housing at Waterloo and his own part in founding the Southwark Civic Awards. From retirement in Shrewsbury he was called back to Southwark to receive the Freedom of the Borough.

But this positive book also looks ahead to what Douglas Bartles-Smith sees as the vital and win-able struggle to keep the Church of England free from being strangled by rampant evangelicals.
