Football comes to County Hall

FIFA Secretary General Michel Zen Ruffinen will be at the opening of the FA Premier League Hall of Fame on the South Bank this month. The new attraction, already dubbed 'the spiritual home of football' by fans, is at County Hall.

The new attraction opens to the public on Saturday 12 June and according to John Motson it will be "a permanent tribute to the footballers of the modern era who have figured significantly in the growth of the Premier League". Those involved in the selection include Sir Geoff Hurst and Bobby Moore.

The Hall of Fame is to be the official institution for honouring English football and is divided into five themed areas. The Hall of Legends is a journey from football's medieval origins to the Premier League. The FA Premier League Hall of Fame is the living history that will grow and develop whilst the Hall of Fans is an attempt to capture the passion and devotion of the football supporter. The climax is a special Hope and Glory film shown in a 120 seat auditorium and the Virtual Stadium where visitors can test computer and football skills.

At last! The Fast Ferry

Upstream, downstream, north bank to south bank, people will be able to use the the Thames as a practical way of getting about London" said John Prescott when launching the ferry service from Bankside Pier.

From this month the fast ferry service runs between Embankment and London Bridge City with a weekday extension to Canary Wharf calling at Nelson Dock. The three SE1 piers involved are Festival, Bankside and London Bridge City. By the beginning of next year the service will also be docking at the BA London Eye at Jubilee Gardens, Blackfriars (north bank) and Tower of London. At present Bankside is not served during the morning rush hour. The first weekend ferry is 9.55am upstream. For the timetable see www.whitehorse.co.uk/fastferries

HMS Belfast leaves the Pool of London

The Pool of London will be without HMS Belfast for a month when the Second World War cruiser visits Portsmouth for a refit.

On Friday 4 June HMS Belfast will leave her permanent mooring for the first time in 17 years. A traditional Irish piper will play on board as Tower Bridge opens at 2.30pm.

Tugs will take HMS Belfast as far as West India Docks where she will be turned and made ready for her two day sea voyage. There are plans to fire her

triple six inch guns as she passes Greenwich.

A number of former members of the ship's company will accompany her on MV Golden Salamander down the Thames.

The departure of HMS Belfast can be followed live on Livesights ThamesCam (www.livesights.com) which provides a 24-hour live picture from the pier to which HMS Belfast is moored.

The House of Bernarda Alba

Following the high profile of last year's Lorca centenary celebrations, the Spanish poet and dramatist's last play comes to the Young Vic at the end of a nationwide tour. Five sisters express their desire for freedom and love against the imprisoning tyranny of their despotic mother, intent on mourning her second husband for eight years. The mad grandmother and domestic servant act as the Greek chorus and provide some of the humour in this powerful performance by Shared Experience Theatre. The simple staging conveys well the heavy heat of Andalucía, balancing the complex drama played out between the characters.

Explore the Millennium Mile

To coincide with the opening of the Southwark Information Centre a free *Explore the Millennium Mile* guide has been published suggesting a walk along the riverside and a 'green path' taking in The Cut, Union Street, Flat Iron Square and Borough Market.

The leaflet, which includes two money off vouchers for the Globe Exhibition and Hayward Gallery, is a joint promotion by the South Bank Employers' Group, Bankside Business Partnership, Pool of London Partnership and Lambeth and

Southwark Councils.

Tourism Minister Janet Anderson began the May Holiday weekend by calling in at the new Southwark Information Centre which has opened on the corner of Duke Street Hill at the end of London Bridge.

Southwark Information Centre is hoping to serve both tourists and residents. There is a bookshop, local history artefacts and a wide range of free literature including copies of *in SE1*.

New OS map shows SE1

Proof that SE1 is part of Central London comes from the Ordnance Survey which includes the area in its new London North Explorer map. New marked landmarks include the Globe Theatre and County Hall's Aquarium. Also marked and named



are the Golden Hinde and HMS Belfast although both can occasionally disappear. The National Trust logo indicates the position of the George in Borough High Street. The only confusion comes with Southwark Station which OS seem to think is west of Hatfields rather than on the corner of The Cut and Blackfriars Road.

The OS Explorer maps cost £5.50 and Greater London is covered by a set of four – two showing the Meridian Line for the first time.

MOMI to close

The Museum of Moving Image on the South Bank is to close at the end of August. Part of the collection will go on tour whilst other elements may go to the Science Museum.

Meanwhile there are plans for a new MOMI as part of the British Film Institute complex which is due to open around 2005. The centre will include the National Film Theatre and Library and be linked to IMAX making the South Bank Britain's film centre.

Book Review

Southwark in paperback

The author of the recent paperback history of Southwark is Leonard Reilly of the Southwark Local Studies Library in Borough High Street. He is surrounded by London's history and in the heart of new finds and new research. He gives a fascinating talk to societies and groups who love this book. It's well illustrated and takes us from the time Southwark was a series of islands along the Thames up to the Butler's Wharf rebirth and the rebuilding of the Globe. Thomas Rowlandson is found recording cattle in the Elephant & Castle in 1800 just before Turner painted the Fighting Temeraire arriving in Rotherhithe.


