# Theatre comes to Elephant & Castle Shopping Centre



The play *Oxford Street*, by Levi David Addai, will take over a shop unit at Elephant & Castle Shopping Centre for a week, transferring from the Royal Court Theatre.

The play is directed by Dawn Walton and the cast will include Preeya Kalidas, Nathaniel Martello-White and Ashley Walters (also known as Asher D of So Solid Crew).

The play, which is set in an Oxford Street sports shop, will be performed in a real-life retail environment from 11 to 14 June.

"The Royal Court exists to experiment, and should not be limited by its four walls," says Dominic Cooke, artistic director of the Sloane Square theatre.

"I am always looking for ways in which we can take our work out of the building and into our local communities, so taking *Oxford Street* to Elephant and Castle sets an exciting precedent. It's certainly something I look to continue and build upon in the coming months."

*Oxford Street* is a boisterous comedy that looks beyond the glossy facade of the high street, at the stories and ambitions of the workers within. At Total Sports, security guard Kofi and his workmates are making sure everything runs smoothly, easing the daily grind with plenty of jokes and chat about the future. Young or old, they all want more from life. The only difference is how they'll go about getting it.

The shop unit where the play will be staged has been provided by St Modwen, the firm which owns the shopping centre.

"We are dedicated towards enhancing the vibrant atmosphere evident within the Elephant and Castle Shopping Centre and are delighted to welcome the prestigious Royal Court Theatre, who we are certain will bring a unique dimension to the retail offer already available," says development surveyor James Stockdale.

The shopping centre already boasts an artist-in-residence. Local artist Reuben Powell is documenting the regeneration of the area and his work is now on display in a shop unit on the first floor.

## Tate to Tate

Buy this book online at [www.inSE1.co.uk/books](http://www.inSE1.co.uk/books)**Tommy Penton's paintings will be on show at the Menier Gallery in September but first comes his book set on the SE1 riverside.***Tate to Tate: An illustrated walk along London's South Bank* is a 32-scene colour panorama by the artist showing a group of people walking east along the Thames Path. The riverside seems unusually well policed although this does not appear to stop a motor scooter from joining the crowd.Brian Parker has supplied what is called the *Walking Companion*. This is notes at the back about the buildings depicted. One problem is that most of the buildings seen are on the north bank. Artistic licence allows *Tate Modern* to be described as "to the right" of Southwark Bridge.

The work was inspired the Tommy's teenage years spent skateboarding under the Queen Elizabeth Hall. It is not clear if this book is aimed at children or adults. But it might keep a family absorbed walking in either direction.

## Trocadero plaque

The Cinema Theatre Association is installing a plaque on the site of the former Trocadero cinema in New Kent Road. The unveiling ceremony - at 2.30pm on Wednesday 4 June - will be performed by Denis Norden who started his career as assistant manager at the cinema in the early 1940s. The most lavish cinema-theatre scheme to be built in South London was the 'Troc' (1930-1963), a building of outstanding design with a seating capacity of 3500.

BOOK REVIEW

**Dorothy Woollard and the etching revival**

Roger Staton • Pegasus Press • £35

Roger Staton, who lives on Bankside, has written a detailed and well-illustrated book about artist Dorothy Woollard.

Forty years ago the author bought some prints for £1 at a closing down sale. Only in the 1990s did he start investigating the life and work of the artist who had meanwhile died at the age of 100.


Her drawings will be familiar to many who never knew her name for in the early Twenties she contributed to the long-running A & C Black 'Sketchbook' series. It featured famous or historic places from Bournemouth to Venice. Among Dorothy Woollard's responsibility was Riverside London with the cover showing the old Southwark Bridge.

Her river book included the main bridges from Lambeth to Tower Bridge with views of Bankside, the Pool of London and St Paul's from the river. The book was printed in nearby Gough Square off Fleet Street.

Roger Staton's life of Woollard is delightful, readable and has drawn together new information. The woodcuts of animals are particularly enjoyable.

It is a definitive book, with a good index, but the author believes there is more to be discovered and has set up a website to help the readers in the search for more pictures.

Copies of the 500 limited edition book are on sale at Bankside Gallery in Hopton Street.
