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Blackfriars Railway Bridge to be 'recreated' in

DRIFT 08, a major riverbased contemporary art exhibition, begins on Friday 26 September.

The exhibition - organised by Southwark-based Illuminate Productions - is a series of strategically-placed artworks in and alongside the Thames between Blackfriars Bridge and Tower Bridge.

The installations include the recreation of the old Blackfriars Railway Bridge through laser light, mythical creatures swimming in the river at twilight at London Bridge and the sounds of a phantom beach echoing around the Millennium Bridge.

Audiences will have the chance to become part of a painting at an installation in the middle of the river across from Tate Modern.

A yacht caught for posterity in the sinking position will also be featured and installed for the exhibition's duration at Canary Wharf.

The installation at Blackfriars Railway Bridge by Keith Bowler coincides with the start of work on the new Blackfriars Station which will span the width of the river as part of the Thameslink programme.

A series of free public boat tours will be run in conjunction with the exhibition where people will be brought along the route of the show to enjoy the installations close up.

Illuminate Productions' previous projects include two shows in the Union Works building near Shakespeare's Globe.

BERMONDSEY STREET SET

LONDON BOROUGH OF SOUTHWARK

Local musicians and vocalists, artisans and cooks, fashion designers and jewellers, hounds and historians are all set for the second annual Bermondsey Street Festival.

This year's festival on Saturday 13 September will build on the success of the inaugural event in 2007.

The daytime programme of stalls, entertainment and activities starts at 12 noon in Tanner Street Park and runs till 5pm. In the evening the focus shifts to the newly completed Bermondsey Square development where the open-air cinema facility will be used for the first time for a screening of The Rocky Horror Picture Show from 7pm.

To celebrate the creative talent of the area a fashion

show will run during the afternoon. Featuring clothes and accessories designed in the area, the local models, male and female, will also have their make up and hair refined by local specialists.

The famous Bermondsey Street dog show - this year in aid of the Blue Cross animal welfare charity - will be judged by TV vet Marc Abraham.

A local historian and Blue Badge guides will be on hand to answer questions and take visitors on short walks.

There will be games and activities for children of all ages, including a tennis work out and coaching session.

Food and drink stalls include The Garrison, The Hide and Village East.

BOOK REVIEW

Historic Views of London

Victorian photographs from the collection of Bernard Hawarth-Loomes have been grouped in themes with captions by Ann Saunders, editor of the London Topographical Record.

This is an interesting and useful book which will help to build a better picture of London's Victorian years especially in and around the Pool of London. The book has the only known photograph of the first Blackfriars Bridge demolished in 1869.

London Bridge is well documented with an 1850s traffic jam at the top of Duke Street Hill. A notice on the left hand side reads: "Down Steps for Clacton, Harwich, Southend and Gravesend."

Looking across from the 'Surrey Side' to St Paul's, the foreground is full of square-rigged vessels.

There is an 1870s view of the Floral Hall standing in Covent Garden. It was designed by Charles Barry's son EM Barry in 1859 for the flower market. Now it is in Borough Market and seen best from Park Street where it appears below the tower of Southwark Cathedral.

Two pictures show the new St George's Cathedral as known to its architect Augustus Pugin. He gave the complex a walled courtyard with trees at the church's east end (pictured above right). In 1850 St George's Road is traffic free.

The cover photograph was taken from Southwark Bridge shortly before



A Century of London **Murders & Executions**

Next year it will be a century since Waterloo resident Cissie Archer died on the corner of Stamford Street and Waterloo Road after being shot in a fish and chip shop.

The murder was late on a winter evening and the 24 year old woman was shot as she looked at a display of crabs. Benjamin Vanderlius, who ran the shop, was shot in the hand. Fortunately the gun jammed as a third shot was attempted. The gunman, who was a lodger at the Trafalgar Hotel in York Road, was hanged on the 10

The book details this incident among more than 150 murders which took place in the capital during the 20th century. Some, like the Waterloo shooting, are largely forgotten although at the time they were often a sensation. This could be a depressing book but it does include some interesting social history. The large scale street maps used to locate some locations, although not the Waterloo murder, are particularly interesting.

The photograph for the Cissie Archer murder shows the Doulton tile entrance to the Schiller International University building on the corner of Stamford Street. In 1909 this would have been the new Royal Waterloo Hospital building where some help was available.
