

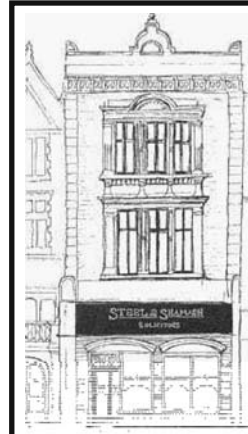

Bermondsey Street Festival



The third Bermondsey Street Festival (Saturday 19 September) promises to be the biggest yet, with events in Tanner Street Park supplemented by stalls in the street and a full programme in Bermondsey Square.

The street will be lined by more than 50 stalls stocking everything from handmade jewellery to vintage

accessories and scarves to sculptures.

Food stalls in Tanner Street Park will include a Garrison hog roast, a Bermondsey Kitchen barbecue, cocktails from Village East, Greek treats from Fotis and delicacies from Del'Aziz and Fine Foods.

The park will also have a children's corner and be host to the lively maypole dancers. Also watch out for street performers from Southwark Playhouse who will be making an appearance.

There will also be an opportunity

to learn about the area's history on a guided walk with a Blue Badge guide. Southwark Cyclists will be offering local rides and advice.

Entertainment in Bermondsey Square includes live bands, live comedy, belly dancing courtesy of Del'Aziz restaurant and an outdoor film screening organised by Rob Wray's Shortwave Cinema.

Delfina will be hosting the first Bermondsey Street Festival Art Gallery featuring local artists.

BOOK REVIEW

Lambeth, Kennington & Clapham Britain in Old Photographs

This updated title in the 'Britain in Old Photographs' series has plenty to fascinate the Waterloo resident.

This selection of images from the archives held by Lambeth Council is divided into five sections, with the first 35 pages devoted to the Lambeth Riverside and North Lambeth.

Dudman has included a number of William Strudwick's pictures of St Mary at Lambeth (now the Garden Museum) and its immediate environs in the 1860s which give a clear impression of the village of 'old Lambeth' that has now largely disappeared. The images also chronicle the construction of Albert Embankment and provide a valuable reminder of the streets and homes that were swept away.

Waterloo locals will appreciate the mid-20th century depictions of street life and market stalls in The Cut and Lower Marsh.

The book includes two 1898 views of the Lambeth Baths and Washhouses at the junction of Kennington Road and Lambeth Road. Over the page is a 1945 picture showing the aftermath of a V2 rocket impact which left the baths damaged beyond repair.



As the author notes in her caption to a 1915 photograph of seven trams converging on Vauxhall Cross, traffic congestion is nothing new.

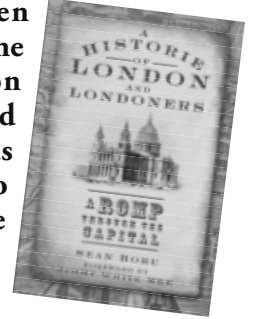
Although many of the pictures in this paperback (which was first published in 1996) can nowadays be freely viewed online at landmark.lambeth.gov.uk there is no substitute for the hours of delight that people who know the borough will derive from browsing the book.

The author has been resident historian on the Capital Gold London breakfast show and more recently he was creative director to the London Bridge Experience.



The publisher wisely subtitled this paperback "a romp through the capital" as there seems to be a lot of historical gossip here.

Key years have been highlighted but those featuring Southwark and Lambeth have some odd highlights. Southwark Cathedral is called a 'minster' when it was a 'priory'. Marie Overs is claimed as its founder which is not a widely held view.

The 1415 entry makes no mention of Henry V arriving in Borough High Street from Agincourt but a lot about the popular claim that the two finger gesture was invented as an insult to the defeated French.

The most surprising claim is that the Globe Theatre caught fire in 1613 as a result of a cannon being fired in honour of James I who was at the performance. The cannon was part of the play and there appears to be no record of the king being present.

This is a fun book which should be read with caution.
