



Apple Day in Southwark

North Lambeth Expo comes to Waterloo

Waterloo Action Centre hosts the second annual North Lambeth Expo on Saturday 10 October.

The annual area expo events were introduced by Lambeth Council's ruling Labour regime to replace the old area committee system. This year's event has been jointly organised by the Kennington, Oval and Vauxhall Forum with Waterloo Community Coalition (WaCoCo).

There will be stalls, music and entertainment and an appearance by the Mayor of Lambeth, Cllr Christopher Wellbelove.

Lambeth's proposal for a pop-up urinal for late night drinkers in Waterloo will be up for debate. The day includes a chance to put questions to councillors about local issues.

BOOK REVIEW

A New Millennium at Southwark Cathedral

Investigations into the first two thousand years

This large format paperback is a highly readable and well-illustrated history of the Southwark Cathedral site from the Romans to today.

Maps and diagrams show changes on the riverside as houses and monastic domestic buildings were replaced by warehouses. Only recently have we achieved the clear view from the river of the north side of the ancient priory turned cathedral church.

The oldest part of the church site is the tower crossing. But the fine Augustinian priory visited in December 1170 by St Thomas Becket was still not quite as long as today's church. The lovely retrochoir was added during the following century.

Maps show that when standing outside the men's toilets today you are at the south-west turn of the cloister.

Pictures show monastic buildings on the north side surviving as late as 1825 with chickens running around a yard. A decade later they were in serious disrepair. Ptolemy Dean's coloured sketches record builders laying foundations for the Millennium buildings on the same site in the 1990s.

Dean Colin Slee describes this as a "vibrant tale of community" and claims that "the very stones are soaked in the character, prayer and unconventionality of Southwark".

The book is the work of devoted archaeologists who, without either a medieval or new refectory, spent many hours discussing finds over refreshment at My Tea Shop and The Wheatsheaf which appear in the long list of acknowledgements.

Southwark Lido

Gattaciovca • £10

The Southwark Lido, which delighted locals and visitors during its short life in Union Street in Summer 2008, lives on through this paperback.

The lido was a temporary installation on a plot of derelict land as part of the London Festival of Architecture.

The book records through words and pictures the contribution so many people made to the project – from the young people taking part in SOWF's Street Genius programme to Bankside Open Spaces Trust.

Property developer Roger Zoglovich writes about how the lido project "sidestepped the abstract and frustrating limitations of long-term development processes to create a real and pleasurable place". He says that the lido taught him about the benefits of conversation rather than confrontation and that "development can simply be a process of gradual occupation, allowing many constituencies to participate and make a site their own".

In his chapter, Peter Graal of Bankside Open Spaces Trust describes how when the time came for the lido to be demolished, the plants were given away to older SE1 residents who had been part of "Bankside's metamorphosis from a place of pollution and industry to one of leisure and creative pursuit".

A fascinating diagram reveals where the materials for the lido were sourced: pebbles from Erith, sandals from Bermondsey Street's Terra Plana and much else besides from Travis Perkins in Redcross Way.

At the end of the book a similar chart shows how everything was reused afterwards: the timber went to Climate Camp and two beach huts were donated to BOST whilst other items were sold to fund the travel of the Paris-based EXYZT collective that, along with Sara Muzio, made the whole thing possible.

This book, produced in a limited edition of 600, is a valuable record of a summer of community-building activity in the heart of Bankside that won't be forgotten for a long time.
