Ten years of Tate Modern

Tate Modern was opened by the Queen ten years ago this month.



Since then more than 45 million people have passed through the doors of the former Bankside Power Station, and the area has changed significantly. According to Tate's figures the population of Bankside has more than doubled in the past 12 years and the number of people working in the area has grown from 3,000 to 50,000.

The anniversary of the gallery's opening is Wednesday morning 12 May when there will be a procession of 300 children from Borough Market to the gallery led by a samba band. Visitors will be invited to enjoy a slice of birthday cake which is inspired by the building.

The birthday weekend, when the Tate will be open until midnight on the Friday and Saturday nights, is 14 to 16 May. A free arts festival called No Soul For Sale with 50 independent art spaces and collectives in the Turbine Hall promises 'cutting-edge events' including performances, music and a film to mark 10 years of Tate Modern.

The Turbine Hall's bridge is the start of a decorated wheel barrow procession on Saturday afternoon celebrating Tate Modern's partnership with Bankside Open Spaces Trust which is also ten years old. Residents and friends are invited to come dressed in bright colours and follow the fun on scooter, buggy or mobility vehicle or foot.

On Sunday artist collective Black Dogs will create a space for conversation about the visitor's relationship to Tate Modern. Visitors are encouraged to bring along an object or image that represents their relationship to the gallery and watch as it becomes part of a temporary display.

CALLING UNDISCOVERED ARTISTS

Undiscovered artists could soon see their work displayed at Tate Modern as part of its tenth birthday celebrations.

The Museum of Everything is calling all non-exhibited artists to submit their work to 'Exhibition #2' which will be held at the Tate as part of the 'No Soul For Sale' festival.

The Museum of Everything is an art space for non-traditional and marginal artists and is one of over 70 independent collectives invited by the Tate to create unique projects as part of the three-day festival.

"The artists we are looking for are not professionally trained. They are self-taught usually and some do not even consider themselves artists, such as those working in secret or those with developmental disabilities," said Melissa Emery from the Museum of Everything.

To enter, budding artists are invited to take their unframed work in person to Tate Modern from 14 to 16 May where a panel of artists and curators will decide if it is right for the show.

"For this exhibition, we are limiting our search to works on paper," said Melissa. "The art has to be brought in person because we're only a small operation and can't really manage this any other way."

If successful, their work will be displayed in the world's most visited gallery of modern art, published in a catalogue and invited to enter The Museum of Everything's permanent collection.

"We're really excited to see what arrives as it's an experiment for us," said Melissa. "It's a fantastic opportunity for people to join in with the country's unusual and hidden creative activity."

Florence Nightingale Museum reopens

The new Florence Nightingale Museum opens this month following a £1.4 million redevelopment.

The museum at St Thomas' Hospital is on the site of Florence Nightingale's first Training School for Nurses and boasts an unparalleled collection of 'Nightingalia'.

Visitors will be issued with headphones in the form of a special stethoscope with which to listen to the story of the pioneer nurse. Objects include the medicine chest taken to the Crimean War and a register of nurses serving in Russia including nuns from Dockhead at Bermondsey.

The museum is being formally re-opened by Princess Alexandra on Tuesday 11 May, Florence Nightingale's 190th birthday, with the first public admission on the following day.
