



Orchard & Jellyfish Theatre to be created on Union St

Two exciting projects will take shape on Union Street this month as part of the build-up to the London Festival of Architecture – and everyone's invited to get involved.

Union Street is at the heart of the Bankside Urban Forest which is one of the key elements of this year's London Festival of Architecture.

The empty plot at 100 Union Street – still fondly remembered as the site of the temporary Southwark Lido created during the 2008 LFA – will this month become the Union Street Urban Orchard.

Designed by Heather Ring of the Wayward Plant Registry and built in collaboration with Bankside Open Spaces Trust, the orchard is intended as a place of exchange between local residents and visitors to the architecture festival.

85 fruit trees have already been delivered to the site. Between 1 and 18 June volunteers are invited to help build the orchard: assistance with planting, painting and construction is required before the site opens to the public on 19 June.

The orchard will be open until 19 August and will host a plant adoption and exchange programme, as well as workshops on biodiversity and urban food growing.

In September the garden will be dismantled and the trees given to local estates and community

gardens as a lasting legacy of the 2010 London Festival of Architecture.

Meanwhile a few hundred yards away at the Marlborough Playground award-winning Berlin-based architects Kaltwasser and Köbberling will work alongside volunteers to create The Jellyfish Theatre which will be the UK's first fully-functional theatre made from recycled and reclaimed materials.

Focusing on energy efficiency, cooperation and human-scale construction, the Jellyfish Theatre will be previewed as part of the London Festival of Architecture in July and opened as an exhibition and workshop space. Two specially commissioned plays will be staged in the theatre in September. The structure will be demolished and recycled in October.

The theatre is part of the Oikos Project which is a partnership between the Red Room theatre company and the Architecture Foundation.

Local residents are invited to donate timber and materials for the theatre and/or become volunteer builders, carpenters and unskilled hands starting from 7 June. To get involved email project manager Ben Melchior on ben@theredroom.org.uk

A new way to explore Southwark

Tourists and residents will soon be able to learn more about local history using City Insights' network of more than 40 markers linked to a mobile-friendly website.

City Insights makes it possible for visitors to discover stories associated with specific buildings or streets by using their mobile phones, a postcode and a mobile-friendly website.

With Southwark Council's permission, City Insights is attaching coloured discs to lamp posts next to locations that have interesting stories associated with them. The discs give the location's postcode and the address of the mobile-friendly website. Anyone spotting the discs can use their phone to get quick, free access to stories such as Albion Mills, the inspiration for Blake's 'dark, satanic mills', the deadly Great Fire of Tooley Street, and Shackleton's last Antarctic expedition.

The pilot scheme – which covers the area from Blackfriars Bridge in the west to Shad Thames in the east – goes live on Saturday 19 June to coincide with the London Festival of Architecture.

"When you walk along, the streets become like a huge encyclopedia that you can browse as you want," says Mark Woods of City Insights.


