The Bankside Urban Forest

The Bankside Urban Forest project will be the focus of the final weekend of this year's London Festival of Architecture on Saturday 3 and Sunday 4 July.

As well as the Union Street Urban Orchard and Jellyfish Theatre we reported last month, there will be plenty of small-scale events and installations. Many of the events form part of the International Architecture Student Festival.

To celebrate the bicentenary of the town of Bournemouth, graduates from the Arts University College Bournemouth will occupy Gatehouse Square off Park Street on Saturday 3 July and invite residents and passers by to participate in beach life and sand play at their beach hut.

In nearby Maiden Lane students from Central Saint Martins will be holding their London Flapjack Association event.

Bankside Community Space is hosting a tea party and an exhibition of local photographs.

The Railway Children at Waterloo Station



Waterloo's disused Eurostar terminal will be transformed into a theatre this month for the opening of *The Railway Children*, a stage adaptation of E Nesbit's classic book.

A 66-tonne Great Northern Railway Stirling Single locomotive – dating from 1870 – will feature in the stage production along with the gentlemen's saloon carriage that appeared in the 1970 film of E Nesbit's book.

Mike Kenny's adaptation of *The Railway Children* opens on 4 July and is booking until 4 September.

The professional cast, including Marshall Lancaster, David Baron, Nicholas Bishop, Louisa Clein and Caroline Harker, will be joined by a supporting cast of young people from Lambeth and Southwark.

The production is supporting the Railway Children charity which helps homeless and runaway children around the world; £1 from each ticket sale will be donated to the charity.

Elephant & Castle drama

The new play *Elephant 21* aims to capture the vibrancy of 21st century Elephant & Castle before the major regeneration of the area takes place.

The Mayhem Company trained volunteers to act as oral historians who then interviewed people that have lived and loved in Elephant & Castle.

These collected stories have inspired the play *Elephant 21* which will be performed this month in the Royal Court's Theatre Local space at the Elephant & Castle Shopping Centre.

The plot of *Elephant 21* weaves through the past hundred years told through four generations of the Valentine family in a play about war, sarsparilla, knickerbocker glories, more war, suicide, jiving and unrequited love.

The cast will be a mixture of young non-professionals from The Mayhem Company, professional actors and older non-professionals from Blackfriars Settlement.

The Mayhem Company is hosted by SE1 United at the Spirit Level in Royal Festival Hall.

DVD REVIEW

CH Spurgeon: The People's Preacher

This 75 minute film is a drama documentary starring Stephen Daltry as Charles Spurgeon who preached from the huge pillared tabernacle at the Elephant & Castle for thirty years.

It is a delightful story told by Andrew Harrison who pops up between scenes to show us the actual site of an incident or building today. The film opens in rural Essex when the preacher was born and depicts him as a teenager in Cambridge where he is first invited to preach.

When the congregation at the Park Street Chapel on Bankside invites young Spurgeon to be their minister then Andrew Harrison soon appears to show us the very spot in Park Street now covered by the HSBC offices. The narrator is again on the screen when the Spurgeon moves to the Elephant in 1861. Before the original building behind the still familiar facade was bombed in the Second World War it could seat 6,000.

The Elephant was a destination for Victorian tourists on a Sunday morning. Spurgeon's book royalties paid for an extensive and controversial social action mission which fed the poor and even provided homes and schools. Publishing also paid for his large house in better air to the south where he could keep his 12,000 books.

The DVD includes an extra 28-minute programme called *Spurgeon: A Closer Look* and a 15-minute film showing how the documentary was made.

Competition to find new Blackfriars Bridge artwork

The winner of a new art competition will have their work displayed on the hoardings on the eastern side of Blackfriars Bridge for a year.

Last September Network Rail installed several large-scale reproductions of Thames watercolours on the long hoarding that prevents pedestrians using the eastern pavement of Blackfriars Bridge during the construction of the new railway station.

Now the search is on to find a new work to adorn the hoarding which is seen by thousands of people each day.

London Lives is a free-to-enter art competition run by Bankside Gallery, Cass Art and Network Rail with support from *The Guardian*.

The competition aims to explore the concept of London and what it is, celebrating its energy, diversity and originality.

Artists entering the competition will have their work judged by a panel of five associated with the capital's art industry and be in the running to win either the gold medal (first place), silver medal (runner up) or one of 20 highly commended places.

The gold medal winner will have their artwork reproduced at a large scale and emblazoned on the hoardings on the bridge for a year.

Their work will also figure in a two week selling exhibition at Bankside Gallery that will showcase the competition's top 100 short-listed entries, and they will receive a commemorative certificate plus £1,500 worth of gift vouchers from Cass Art.
