## From NY to SE1 via LA

A combination of theatre, game and walking tour which has been a hit on the streets of New York and Los Angeles arrives in SE1 this month.

*Accomplice* co-creator Tom Salamon tells us how it works: "We start from noon to 4pm on Saturdays and Sundays. A different group of 10 will start every half an hour. You can buy 10 tickets and come with all your friends or you can buy two tickets and you'll be paired with other people in that time slot.

"You'll get a phone call the day before that tells you where to meet. You show up at that spot and you get dropped into the story.

"The show's about two and a half hours from start to finish. It's probably about a mile of walking, 10 minutes at a time, and then a scene will take place, and then another 10 minutes trying to find the next location."

The secret is that "you as the audience never know who the actors are and who regular strange people out on the street are," says Tom.

## September of Sculpture



Untitled by Peter Randall-Page

**Purdy Hicks Gallery, Jerwood Space and Dulwich Picture Gallery have teamed up for a multi-site exhibition of sculpture by Peter Randall-Page.**

Jerwood Space on Union Street will be showing three new works acquired on long-term loan sculpted from rare pink multi figured Rossa Luna marble. To coincide with the launch of this piece they will also be showing a small group of works by Randall-Page from 16 to 18 September during Open House weekend.

Purdy Hicks Gallery in Hopton Street is holding an exhibition of his sculpture and works on paper. The gallery will be collaborating with Hopton's Almshouses and two major works will be displayed in the beautiful gardens.

A little further afield Dulwich Picture Gallery will begin its bicentenary celebrations this month with its first ever acquisition of a piece of contemporary sculpture. The work by Peter Randall-Page entitled *Walking the Dog* is inspired by the gallery's famous building.

Works by Randall-Page are already familiar fixtures in SE1's public spaces; he created the memorial to Mohegan Chieftain Sachem Mahomet Weyonomon, in Southwark Cathedral's southern churchyard, which was unveiled by the Queen in 2006 and *Exotic Cargo* can be seen on the riverside at Butler's Wharf.

## Pope to visit Lambeth

**Pope Benedict XVI will visit Lambeth Palace during his state visit to the UK this month.**

The Pope is due to arrive at Lambeth Palace at 4pm on Friday 17 September. He will meet the Most Revd Dr Rowan Williams, Archbishop of Canterbury, and make a speech.

He will leave Lambeth Palace by Popemobile and there will be an opportunity to see the Pope as he crosses Lambeth Bridge and travels along Millbank to Westminster Hall where he is due to make another speech at 5.10pm.

The Metropolitan Police has warned that there is limited space along Friday's Popemobile route from Lambeth to Westminster and vantage points are limited. The Met advises that there will be better opportunities to see the Holy Father on Saturday along Horse Guards Road, The Mall and Constitution Hill.

The last papal visit to London was in 1982. Pope John Paul II visited St George's Cathedral in Southwark where he ministered to the sick and elderly.


