



The Elephant Project

A group of artists and friends is taking up residence in the Elephant & Castle Shopping Centre this month.

Local resident and recent Royal College of Art graduate Rebecca Davies, who has been creating work based around the Elephant community, is encouraging a creative response to the forthcoming regeneration of the area.

'The Elephant', a temporary space in unit 215, will play host to workshops, screenings and talks all inspired by the regeneration.

The project runs from Monday 1 to Friday 12 November in the upper-level shop unit recently vacated by the Royal Court theatre after the end of their 'Theatre Local' season.

The programme of events includes a talk by Stephen Humphrey on the history of the Elephant & Castle with a focus on the area's heyday between 1850 and 1940. See listing on page 4.

Oldest and greenest cars come to Lambeth



More than 500 cars, tricars and motor tricycles dating from before 1905 will pass through the streets of North Lambeth on Sunday 7 November.

The 77th London to Brighton Veteran Car Run starts in Hyde Park at 7am. The cars will pass over Westminster Bridge, down Westminster Bridge Road and south along Kennington Road.

This year the run's organisers have launched the Future Car Challenge as a companion event to be held on Saturday 6 November. Starting in Brighton, the latest low-energy vehicles will follow the LBVCR route in reverse. The lineup of 19 electric vehicles, 25 hybrid vehicles and 20 low-emission internal combustion engine cars will pass through SE1 during the late morning.

"The Future Car Challenge is set to show off a fantastic range of greener transport choices," says Mayor of London Boris Johnson. "I want London to be leaders in the take up of vehicles fuelled by low polluting technologies."

Trophies will be awarded for vehicles judged to have made the least energy impact during the 60-mile Brighton to London run.

Public art on the Thames

Drift 2010, a contemporary art exhibition held every two years on and around the River Thames, returns this month.

James Capper's *Sea Light* is a wind-powered fog light that will be placed directly into the waters of the Thames at Bankside Pier. It will cast as eerie glow on the river as night falls.

bit.fall by Julius Popp is also coming to Bankside. A series of valves open to let droplets of water fall to form letters and words.

Another installation, *flowlight*, will be installed on the north bank and is designed to be viewed from Bankside and the Millennium Bridge.

Drift is organised by Borough-based Illuminate Productions. The inaugural Drift exhibition in 2008 featured Keith Bowler's laser-beam evocation of the old Blackfriars Railway Bridge and Andy Harper's *Feast of Skulls* decorated buoy at Bankside Pier. Speakers on the Millennium Bridge played the sounds of seagulls.

This month the Princess Royal will open the Lord Ashcroft Gallery, at the Imperial War Museum. It is the IWM's first major permanent gallery for ten years. The gallery, paid for by a £5 million donation from Lord Ashcroft, will house the Extraordinary Heroes exhibition containing the world's largest collection of Victoria Crosses (VCs), which has been established by Lord Ashcroft since 1986. The 162 awards, which range from the Crimean to the Falklands wars, will go on public display for the first time alongside 48 VCs and 31 George Crosses (GCs) already held by the museum. Visitors to the Lord Ashcroft Gallery's Extraordinary Heroes exhibition will discover the personal stories behind each decoration in a state-of-the-art new space filled with interactive touch-screens, multimedia platforms and original interpretation.

Sackler Studios

On Wednesday 10 November the Duke of Edinburgh will open Shakespeare's Globe's new Sackler Studios building in Park Street. The Sackler Studios, made possible by charitable donations and a generous primary grant from The Dr Mortimer and Theresa Sackler Foundation, will provide Globe Education with four workshop studios and a rehearsal space for students and actors.

BOOK REVIEW

George Myers: Pugin's Builder

On the terrace of houses opposite St George's Cathedral there a blue plaque to George Myers. He was a builder whose main work was erecting buildings by architect Augustus Pugin.

This unique book tells Myers' story but also shows how Southwark played a pivotal role in the great architect's life. Pugin was living in Walworth when he married Jane Knill at St George's which had been designed by the bridegroom and built by Myers.

Patricia Spencer-Silver tells us that without Myers' involvement Pugin "could not have accomplished such an enormous amount of work as he did in his short life". Myers operated from Ordnance Wharf (now covered by County Hall) where a bridge crossed Belvedere Road to workshops. There he and his team carved angels and doorways for Pugin's masterpieces.

The altar at Mayfair's Farm Street Church was made on the riverside as was the altar and lectern for St John's Cathedral in Newfoundland. Wood for lecterns, pews and gothic dining tables came from nearby Gabriel's Wharf. Myers had built the warehouses at next door Barge House Wharf (now Oxo Tower Wharf).

Pugin's final illness saw him at Myers' house where the patient could be near familiar streets. But eventually he was admitted to Bedlam (now Imperial War Museum) where Myers was already improving the building.

Later the Evelina Children's Hospital (now Mint Street Park) was built by Myers' firm. He also built St Paul's Church (now school site) next to St George's Cathedral.

The cathedral was said to have been built "with pennies of the poor" and on his death bed in 1875 Myers cancelled the large debt still owed to him by St George's.

1415: Henry V's Year of Glory

It's welcome news that Ian Mortimer's book has appeared in paperback so soon after the hardback publication.

This book is potentially of great interest to those who care about Southwark's history for 1415 was the year Henry V came to Borough.

The book attempts an almost day by day record of what the King did. The big event of course was winning the Battle of Agincourt.

Henry is recorded as having stopped at "Southwark Abbey" on Saturday 15 June. Elsewhere in the book this is described as today's Southwark Cathedral. But is it? Our present cathedral was Southwark Priory. The abbey was in today's Bermondsey Square.

The King reached Kingston that evening and Winchester the next day. This was the road to war starting at Southwark.

In victory Henry returned to Southwark but did so by coming up Old Kent Road. When he reached Borough High Street a massed choir sang from the steps of St George the Martyr.

The author records Henry having been up early at Eltham on Saturday 23 November and reaching Borough High Street about 10am. But where is the detail about Southwark's choir singing the Agincourt song? Or the King's appreciation of his capital's oldest church dedicated to St George who had brought victory at Agincourt?

But Ian Mortimer does tell us about the figure of St George painted on linen hanging on London Bridge. Henry raised the status of the patron saint's day and ordered that in death his body must be taken to St George the Martyr in Borough prior to the funeral.

The 600th anniversary of Agincourt is just five years away. This book might give us ideas for a celebration.
