



White Cube Bermondsey opens this month

White Cube has announced that its new gallery in the former Recall warehouse on Bermondsey Street will open on 12 October.

The gallery will open six months after Southwark's planning committee approved the conversion of the disused warehouse for use by White Cube.

The new Bermondsey space is bigger than either of White Cube's existing Hoxton and Mayfair galleries.

"The opening of White Cube Bermondsey is an affirmation of the ongoing strength of London as a creative hub and the next chapter in White Cube's history," says gallery owner Jay Jopling.

"I'm immensely excited by the opportunities it will give us to expand the range and ambition of all aspects of our programme, not least the chance to make even more quality exhibitions with world-class artists."

White Cube originally intended to use the warehouse for storage but soon realised it had potential as a space for public exhibitions. The company has a 15-year lease on the site which was previously earmarked for a large residential development.

Architects Casper Mueller Kneer have overseen the conversion of the 1970s warehouse to include three exhibition spaces, storage, private viewing rooms, an auditorium and a bookshop.



The 'South Galleries' will provide the principal display area. Three smaller galleries, collectively known as the 'North Galleries', will feature an innovative new programme of exhibitions.

At the centre of the building there is a gallery of 81 square metres entitled '9 x 9 x 9'.

An auditorium will allow White Cube to present an education programme, artists' films and lectures.

The inaugural exhibition will be 'Structure & Absence', a group show which "uses Chinese scholars' rocks as an organising device to take a fresh look at contemporary abstraction". It includes work by Andreas Gursky, Wade Guyton, Damien Hirst, Sergej Jensen, Brice Marden, Gabriel Orozco, Sterling Ruby, Robert Ryman and Jeff Wall.

The launch of White Cube Bermondsey has been timed to coincide with the Frieze art fair.

The artists have been commissioned by Steve Lazarides whose 2010 Hell's Half Acre exhibition in the tunnels attracted 10,000 visitors.

Participants include Stanley Donwood, Jonathan Yeo, Antony Micallef, Conor Harrington, Doug Foster, 3D, Ian Francis, ATMA, Michael Najjar and Lucy McLauchlan.

There will also be a 120-cover restaurant with food cooked by Michelin-starred chefs.

BOOK REVIEW

Bankside: London's Original District of Sin

Bankside tells the story of the area from the first Roman villa to the luxury flats at Neo Bankside.

The book is strong on heritage. Borough Market is claimed to have started about 1276 and those listed as having dined in Winchester Palace's great hall (seen part ruined in Clink Street) include Simon de Montfort and Elizabeth I.

For once 'sin' found on Bankside is put in context rather than exaggerated. This makes the book both more interesting and authoritative.


It seems that Bankside was always ahead in having theatres and tourist attractions. Today's hotels are merely a return to a thriving hospitality industry which exploited visitors who had been locked out of the City at curfew.

There is good space devoted to William Shakespeare with examples of the many local references in his plays.

A thorough look at the cathedral known to Shakespeare highlights a forgotten memorial to Abraham Newland whose signature appears on the very first pound note.

At first one sees a possible mistake when our oldest hospital is called St Thomas's but persevere and suddenly the spelling changes to St Thomas'. The authors are correct for it is only after the 16th century that there is a double Thomas dedication: Thomas Becket and Thomas the Apostle.

This 275 page hardback is written by two Peterborough-based authors so its lacks some inside



knowledge. But they do question the "necessity" for the Shard and call it "corporate one-upmanship". The pace of change is so fast even in the recession that the final chapter called Reinventing Bankside is already out of date.

But it is a book worth reading for it gathers together much basic history and good stories. There is also a generous choice of key illustrations. Every new resident or incoming business should have a copy.

A garden for Clink Street

A new project backed by Time Team's Tony Robinson aims to improve the setting of the remains of Winchester Palace in Clink Street.

Following a proposal by Clink Street resident David Stephens, Bankside Open Spaces Trust has launched a fundraising appeal to improve the presentation and interpretation of the remains of the great hall of the Bishop of Winchester's London residence.

A sunken garden in a series of oak planting boxes would help to show off the rose window and gable wall and the remnants of the palace hall's foundation walls whilst avoiding damage to them. There will also be leaflets, interpretation boards and a 'Liberty of the Clink' mobile app.
