Tabard Inn recreated

Tacit Theatre is bringing Chaucer's Canterbury Tales home this Christmas with a re-telling of seven of the classic stories.

Southwark Playhouse is just 500 yards away from the site of the Tabard Inn where Chaucer's pilgrims began their journey.
