



London Festival of Architecture

It's had a lido, an orchard and a physic garden – this month a pop-up pub, spa and hotel will appear at 100 Union Street as part of the London Festival of Architecture.

The theme of this year's LFA – held biennially since 2004 – is the 'playful city', examining ways in which both Londoners and visitors can use the city and its buildings in a more creative, interactive and healthy way.

The festival runs from 23 June to 8 July and for the opening weekend (23 & 24 June) the focus is on the City and Southwark.

As well as The reUNION in Union Street, there will be events at the Architecture Foundation in Tooley Street and in Gibbons Rents where a "sociable garden" is being created in a run-down alleyway.

Bankside Community Space will serve as a hub for information on the Bankside Urban Forest.

RedBall comes to South Bank

New York artist Kurt Perschke brings his 15-foot inflatable RedBall to the South Bank this month.

"On the surface, the experience seems to be about the ball itself as an object, but the true power of the project is what it can create for those who experience it," says Kurt Perschke.

"As RedBall travels around the world, people approach me on the street with excited suggestions about where to put it in their city.

"In that moment the person is not a spectator but a participant in the act of imagination. That invitation to engage, to collectively imagine, is the true essence of the RedBall Project."

Borough Road Gallery opens

A gallery devoted to the work of influential figurative artist David Bomberg opens at London South Bank University this month.

David Bomberg taught at the Borough Polytechnic (forerunner of LSBU) in the 1940s and 1950s and was instrumental in the formation of the Borough Group of artists.

Donated to LSBU by collector Sarah Rose, the collection includes approximately 80 paintings and 100 works on paper by Bomberg and other members of the Borough Group.

Last year LSBU received a grant from the Heritage Lottery Fund to renovate part of its Borough Road building and to devise a programme of exhibitions and events linked to the collection.

The first exhibition at the Borough Road Gallery opens on Saturday 23 June at 103 Borough Road. The gallery will be open Wednesday-Saturday 12 noon-6pm and admission is free.

Vessels will muster between Chiswick and Putney in the morning and set off downstream around noon. The Royal party will depart from Chelsea Pier mid-afternoon. The pageant is expected to finish at Tower Bridge around 6pm, with dispersal eastwards into the evening.

- Tower Bridge will be closed to all traffic and pedestrians from 7am until early evening and will host guests from charities and the riparian boroughs as well as private events hosted by the City of London.
- Millennium Bridge and the Jubilee footbridges will be closed and will host guests from charities and riparian boroughs as well as members of the media.
- Vauxhall, Waterloo and London bridges will be open to traffic and pedestrians, apart from central section bridge closures as the flotilla passes underneath them at points between 3pm and 5.30pm. They are all expected to be very crowded and the public sections are only open for the purpose of pedestrian and vehicle traffic, not for viewing.
- Southwark Bridge will be closed to pedestrians, but not to traffic.
- Lambeth, Westminster and Blackfriars bridges will be closed to traffic and pedestrians, but each will have north and south facing viewing screens, with both ends of both bridges open to the public.

Look out for the Avenue of Sail downstream of London Bridge where large vessels will be moored from Friday 1 June.
