



Channel 4's Hotel GB

Anyone turning up at the Bermondsey Square Hotel during the first week of October will be in for a shock when they find Gordon Ramsay running the restaurant, Mary Portas in charge of the rooms and Gok Wan managing the bar.

Channel 4 has taken over the hotel for a week-long series called Hotel GB to be aired every night at 9pm from Monday 1 October.

Presenters and performers associated with Channel 4 including Phil Spencer and Kirstie Allsop will take on key roles at the hotel

The stars will be divided into two teams led by Gordon Ramsay and Mary Portas who will compete to raise as much money as possible for the Prince's Trust and the Springboard charity – and find full-time jobs for their unemployed trainees.

When the TV crews have left, the much-criticised Gregg's Table restaurant will be relaunched as Gregg's Bar & Grill.

An exhibition of images by documentary photographer Paul Reas showing the changing face of the Elephant & Castle will be exhibited at the London College of Communication this month.

"His photographs of incense pots bought from the open market in the Elephant are fascinating indications of the sort of social pressures that the people of this area are subjected to," writes local parish priest and *Guardian* columnist Giles Fraser in a publication to accompany the exhibition.

"The point of these pots is that their contents are burned to provide help in particular situations: 'break up', 'court case', 'money drawing', and 'fast luck'.

"The idea that such problems can be sorted out with the purchase of a can of incense from a Rastafarian bloke on the market is powerfully indicative of the hidden desperation of so many lives, lives that are too often hidden from view."

The exhibition is part of a long-term project to document the regeneration process, *The Elephant Vanishes*, directed by Patrick Sutherland.

Dragon Cafe in Borough

A new cafe and creative space will open its doors this month.

Mental Fight Club, a local group which puts on imaginative events for people of all mental experience, will host the Dragon Cafe every Monday from 10am till 8pm in the crypt of St George the Martyr in Borough High Street.

The affordable refreshments range from a cup of tea to Red Dragon soup and freshly baked rolls. Free hand, hand or foot massage are available. Planned activities in the performance space include basic Tai Chi sessions, non-contact boxing, music, poetry workshops and exhibitions.

The programme on the first day runs until 10pm and will see audio-visual projections in the morning and performances of a short play for adults and children called *Dervish* and performed by Orzu Arts at 1pm, 4pm and 8pm.

The cafe team is currently recruiting volunteers to assist with reception, stewarding, kitchen and cafe work to ensure that the project can increase momentum during the first few weeks.
