

## South Bank Shed



For months pedestrians crossing Waterloo Bridge or strolling along the river have watched a mysterious structure take shape.

The Shed, a bright red wooden box with four ventilation towers, has been built in Theatre Square to give the National Theatre a third performance space whilst the Lyttelton is shut for refurbishment.

Designed by Haworth Tompkins, the 225-seater theatre

will host a programme of new works during its 11-month stay on the South Bank.

The first production, Tanya Ronder's *Table*, is directed by Rufus Norris and opens on Tuesday 9 April.

## St George & Shakespeare

23 April is both St George's Day and the birthday of William Shakespeare.

Most local festivities will be held on Sunday 21 April, including the customary free open afternoon at Shakespeare's Globe (page 3). England and Catalonia have St George as a common patron saint and Borough Market has teamed up with the Catalonian government to present an afternoon of food and entertainment in the Green Market (page 3).

Anglo-Catalan links will also be celebrated at St George the Martyr Church in Borough High Street. After the parish's patronal festival Eucharist (11am) and lunch, the Catalonian sardana dance will be performed in the Tabard Street piazza at 2pm.

In Catalonia St George's Day is associated with the giving of books and the Friends of Southwark Cathedral will hold a book sale on Tuesday 23 April (page 3).
