

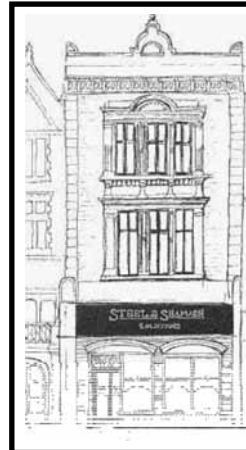

Plans for huge military parade through Southwark

A military parade – thought to be the largest in Southwark since the Second World War – will be held on Sunday 30 June.

Three military units with strong links to Southwark will be granted the freedom of the borough at a ceremony to be held in Geraldine Mary Harmsworth Park at the culmination of a parade through local streets.

The parade, which is due to reach the park at about 11.45am, will be led by The Band of The Life Guards with three other military bands also taking part. It will be followed by a Ceremony of Remembrance and Recognition at 12 noon. The Act of Remembrance will be led jointly by the Anglican Bishop of Southwark, Rt Revd Christopher Chessun, and the Roman Catholic Bishop of the Forces, Rt Revd Richard Moth.

There will also be an afternoon programme of family entertainment from 1pm including refreshments (for purchase), military displays, and a performance by The Military Wives Choir (South London) at 2pm. There will also be performances by The Cherry Belles (Andrews Sisters Tribute Act), and the 40-piece Southwark Concert Band.

"I'm delighted that Southwark Council will be recognising the huge contribution that our local military units and regiments make to the safety of all our residents, and of the country as a whole," said Cllr Ian Wingfield, deputy leader.

"The freedom of the borough is the highest civil honour that we can give, and it is well-deserved by these military units, who have strong ties to the borough and whose numbers include local people. They have played such an important part, both historically and currently, in protecting our nation, and we are all aware that the role of the armed forces is as relevant today as it has ever been."

Waterloo Festival 2013 War and Communities

The Waterloo Festival returns for the third year, this time with the theme of 'War and Communities'

A host of people and organisations are converging on St John's Waterloo, including the National Theatre and the Kreutzer Quartet performing world and UK premières. The festival runs from Thursday 27 June until Tuesday 2 July at St John's Waterloo with a range of classical concerts, music and art workshops and exhibitions, guided walks around Waterloo, a Sunday afternoon fete, a tea dance and much more.

In line with this year's theme, the Waterloo Festival has encouraged the public to become involved by taking part in competitions either to compose a musical score or to show off a talent, for which there are cash prizes for the winners. The Waterloo Festival commissioned a short film and invited local musicals to compose a score. Other skills are also being highlighted in the Waterloo's Got Talent competition.

'in SE1' and the London SE1 community website are official media partners of the Waterloo Festival and the editorial team will be 'in residence' at St John's during the festival; readers are warmly invited to drop in for a chat or to discuss ideas for news stories and features.

This year's artist-in-residence is Dale Inglis who will soak up the atmosphere during the festival. He will present his exhibition at the Waterloo Festival 2014. An exhibition of his recent work is now open at the National Theatre.

Money raised by the festival will benefit The Poppy Factory which helps wounded, sick and injured ex-service men and women find work and War Child, a charity devoted to helping children living in the world's most dangerous war zones.

The exhibition will also be displayed at the New London Architecture gallery in Store Street WC1 between Thursday 6 and Saturday 29 June as part of the London Festival of Architecture.

An illustrated lecture on the event that changed London's fire service forever. Discover the history of insurance fire brigades, the inspirational James Braidwood and why the Tooley Street fire of June 1861, an inferno of devastating proportions, sparked a chain of events leading to the formation of a public fire service in London. The lecture will be delivered in the grand setting of Winchester House, residence of the first chief officer of the London Fire Brigade Captain Shaw, now home to the LFB Museum.
