



Pull Out All The Stops

BBC Radio 3 will take up residence on the South Bank this month as part of a festival to mark the restoration of the Royal Festival Hall organ.

For two weeks from Saturday 15 March many of Radio 3's regular live shows will come from a pop-up radio studio in the RFH's Riverside Cafe.

The partnership will see 15 live concerts and three world premieres broadcast on Radio 3.

The opening gala concert on 18 March features organists John Scott, Isabelle Demers, Jane Parker Smith and David Goode with trumpeter Alison Balsom and the brass sections from Southbank Centre's resident orchestras the Philharmonia Orchestra and London Philharmonic Orchestra.

An exhibition in the Clore Ballroom tells the story of the RFH organ.

Art at the cathedral



For the third year Southwark Cathedral will have an artistic focus to its observance of the Lent season which begins on Ash Wednesday 5 March.

Edmund de Waal's piece, another hour, consists of twelve free-standing vitrines, each nearly 7 ft high and holding a single white porcelain vessel. They will stand in a serpentine line in the retrochoir at the east end of the Cathedral.

Angela Wright's piece is entitled 40 days and is made from spun wool. It will be suspended below the east window of the cathedral, a drop of some 50 ft, covering the altar screen.

"We are delighted that we will have two art works - another hour and 40 days - to accompany our journey from Lent to Holy Week and Easter," said the Very Revd Andrew Nunn, Dean of Southwark.

"These events in the life of Jesus are lived almost in real time by the Christian community and especially in the final week before Easter.

"The encounter with the Living God is both in time and eternity and both of these works will help us to enter more deeply into this mystery and reality."

There will be significant changes to Southern services following the morning peak at London Bridge on Friday 28 March and no Southern services will operate into London Bridge on Saturday 29 and Sunday 30 March.
