

## Local elections on 22 May


**On Thursday 22 May local residents will have the opportunity to decide who will run Southwark and Lambeth councils for the next four years.**

All the indications are that both boroughs will remain in Labour control, but whatever the outcome there will be plenty of new faces on the council benches with many councillors not seeking re-election. Those standing down include former Southwark Council leader Nick Stanton and all three sitting councillors in Bermondsey's Grange ward: Linda Manchester, Denise Capstick and Mark Gattleson.

Bermondsey planning activist Russell Gray is standing as an independent candidate against council leader Peter John in South Camberwell.
