

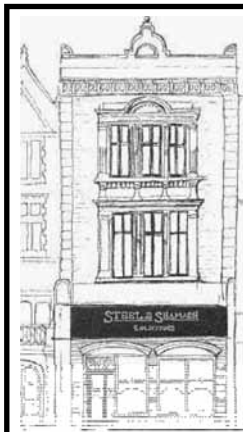

## Celebrating Shad Thames

**A new initiative designed to ensure that the special character of Shad Thames is preserved and enhanced for future generations is launched this month.**

Southwark Council has recently approved a new management plan for the Shad Thames Conservation Area and a new group has been formed to ensure that the document doesn't gather dust on a shelf in the authority's offices.

Shad Thames Area Management Partnership (STAMP) brings together local residents, businesses and council representatives.

On Saturday 14 June the STAMP Local Eyes Festival presents a series of informal discussions and guided walks. The events programme has been timed to coincide with the London Festival of Architecture.

## Tower Bridge 120

**On Monday 30 June the Tower Bridge Exhibition is celebrating the 120th anniversary of the official opening of the bridge by admitting visitors to the high-level walkways for just £1.20.**

Tower Bridge was officially opened on 30 June 1894 by the Prince of Wales (later King Edward VII). The report of the ceremony in *The Times* on 2 July 1894 said: "Under a cloudless sky and as part of a pageant which delighted tens of thousands of people, the new Tower-bridge, which deserves to be reckoned among the greatest engineering triumphs of the Victorian age, was declared open for traffic by land and water by the Prince of Wales with every circumstance of pomp and splendour."

Each visitor taking advantage of the special offer will receive a souvenir ticket which replicates the design of the invitation to the 1894 opening ceremony and can purchase a limited edition commemorative pin badge. Adult admission normally costs £9.

A series of etchings, paintings and memorabilia focusing on Tower Bridge will be on display at Guildhall Art Gallery from Monday 2 June until mid-July. This fascinating exhibition will showcase a range of artwork, from Wyllie's momentous painting of the opening day in 1894 all the way to modern-day interpretations, and will be primarily comprised of pieces from the City's own collection.

A high-quality commemorative souvenir book has been created consisting of full-colour reproductions of the artwork in the exhibition and will be on sale at the Tower Bridge Exhibition and Guildhall Art Gallery gift shops.

Southwark Council and Tower Hamlets Council have recently granted planning permission for a £1 million project to install glass panels in part of the upper walkways. For the first time this will allow visitors to the top of the structure to see its most famous elements – the bascules – in action when the bridge lifts to allow a vessel to pass.

This year's theme is 'War and the World 2014' and the programme includes music and a panel discussion relating to the centenary of the start of the First World War.

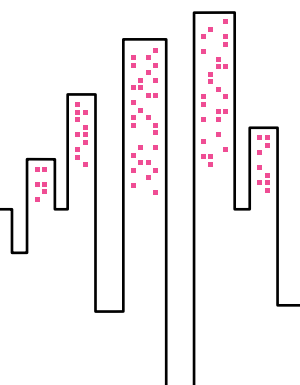
