Threat to historic Boot & Flogger

THE UNIQUE status of Southwark's Boot & Flogger wine bar is under threat.

At present the the bar in Redcross Way is the only premises in the UK allowed to sell wine without having to apply for a licence.

John Davy trades as a 'Free Vintner' being a Freeman of the Vintners' Company based at Vintners' Hall on the north end of Southwark Bridge and in the City of London. The little known Vintners' privilege covers the Square Mile and three miles beyond the City. Also covered are some towns on the road between London and Dover and London and Berwick. Some port towns such as Sandwich and Weymouth are also included. The bars may not sell beers or spirits.

The Boot & Flogger operates under the special dispensation confirmed by James I in 1611. Indeed The Boot & Flogger claims that the right to sell wine without a licence dates from a charter of 1567 granted by Queen Elizabeth I.

The change is proposed in the white paper on licensing called *Time for Reform: Proposals for the Modernisation of our Licensing Laws*. A Home Office spokesperson says: "The point of this legislation is to streamline and simplify the over complex laws regarding liquor licensing."

"It is a great shame" says Vintners Company Clerk Michael Smythe. "It is being done away with for none other than uniformity. It's totally unnecessary"

If legislation is passed John Davy is certain that it would spell the end of the historic wine bar.

The name Boot & Flogger refers to a corking device. The leather boot holds the bottle whilst the wooden flogger 'flogs' in the cork. The Boot & Flogger, just off Southwark Street, is open Mondays to Fridays 11am to 8pm. Regulars and visitors have been eagerly coming forward to sign a petition to be presented to the House of Commons before any legislation is debated.

Ferry bad news

WHITE HORSE Fast Ferries, the riverbus company whose central London service was launched during a visit by John Prescott to Bankside, has ceased operations.

However, those living and working on Bankside had little chance of enjoying the service since the daily Central London Fast Ferry was withdrawn last December and replaced with a weekday peak hours service which bypassed Bankside Pier.

Despite a plan to restore the full service in time for the opening of Tate Modern, White Horse this summer offered only a shuttle from Bankside to the London Eye

for £4.90 return. Previously an Embankment to Canary Wharf single was £1.90.

White Horse's problems were heightened by low passenger numbers on its Greenwich-Dome shuttle service, leading to the withdrawal of all its London services this autumn. Contrary to media reports, the City Cruises service from Waterloo and Blackfriars to the Dome is unaffected.

Bankside Residents' Forum is investigating the future of the multi-million pound Bankside Pier and asking Transport for London and the GLA about a replacement service.

Tate Modern continues to break records

New displays for Turbine Hall announced

An **AVERAGE** of 18,000 visitors are now passing through Tate Modern on Bankside every day. Figures indicate that the total was higher at weekends and during half term holiday week last month. The visitor total passed the 3 million mark late in October. There is speculation that another million could visit by 31

December. Postcard sales have reached 1.5 million.

Spanish artist Juan Muñoz is to undertake the second in the Unilever series of commissions for the Turbine Hall. His 500 foot long and 100 foot high installation, replacing the towers by Louise Bourgeois, will open in June next year.

Millennium Bridge: the saga continues

The Millennium Bridge is likely to remain closed until summer 2002.

There are growing doubts that the proposed £5m remedy for the mysterious wobble can solve the problem.

It now being suggested that The Queen, who was persuaded to 'open' the bridge before its completion, may find the real opening taking place during her 50th Jubilee Year celebrations.

Initial tests are expected to be completed early in 2001 and any new work could take at least six months.

Lambeth gets tough on illegal traders: will Southwark follow?

Lambeth Council has moved to ban ice cream vans from operating on the South Bank and in the surrounding streets as far away as The Cut. Noise and pollution from the vans' running engines have brought numerous complaints from visitors and residents.

Last month the Council, working with the police, took action against nuisance traders believed to be operating illegally. As many as 33 hot food trolleys and other stalls were seized. The Council hopes that costs of the operation will be awarded by the courts.

But the large commercial businesses on the South Bank

have been asked to help fund an on-going enforcement operation as some unlicensed trading is taking place off the designated public highway.

Meanwhile those living on Bankside, which is in the Borough of Southwark, are continuing to complain about noise and illegal trading around Tate Modern. The former power station has been ringed by up to ten ice cream vans all with engines running throughout the day. The Bankside Residents' Forum has been asking Southwark Council to take action.

SHAKESPEARE PROOF

Researchers, using software designed to help companies manage their documentation, have declared that Shakespeare's play Henry VIII was probably written by him alone. It has long been suggested that the 1611 play, with its Blackfriars setting and reference to the Paris Garden on the south bank, was the work of John Fletcher.

MARKET LEADER

Out of the 50 best markets in Britain two are in SE1. Both Borough Market and the riverside Book Market under Waterloo Bridge are included in *The Independent's* guide to Britain's best markets. "Some of Britain's best artisan producers are represented" in Borough Market according to Paul Richardson who helped in the survey.

BUILDING AWARDS

SE1 has picked up two awards in the Royal Institute of Chartered Surveyors annual Building of the Year contest to encourage conservation and regeneration. Both the London Eye and Tate Modern won Special Awards. Other winners were Lulworth Castle in Dorset and the Great Glasshouse in Camarthenshire.

JUBILEE GARDENS PLAN

Residents are to be consulted on a new controversial plan to redevelop Jubilee Gardens. The garden will be redesigned with tiers to allow for the building of a new BFI film centre and a concert hall. Shops may be added under the revamped garden to generate income. A planning application will be lodged next year with work starting in 2001.



Book Review

Jubilee Line Extension

IT'S DIFFICULT to believe that the Jubilee Line Extension has only been open for a year now. Taking the Tube has already become a natural part of travelling about in SE1. Yet every time I pass through Southwark I still marvel at the beauty of the of the station. *The Jubilee Line Extension* by Kenneth Powell (Laurence King Publishing, £25) is a celebration of this much-admired part of the London Underground. With a foreword by Chief Architect Roland Paoletti, the lavishly illustrated book looks in turn at each of the stations between Westminster and Stratford. But the book doesn't neglect service structures such as air vents and escape shafts, including the Redcross Way Substation. The conclusion explores the relationship between the JLE and the places it serves, including its role as a link to Tate Modern.


