
Greening the Bankside Triangle

➔ Richard Rogers unveils Tate Modern's "integrated vision" for Bankside

GREEN ROUTES radiating south and Southwark Street transformed into a 'boulevard' are among the Richard Rogers Partnership proposals for Bankside.

The urban study, commissioned by Tate Modern to help establish a shared integrated vision of how Bankside should grow and develop, also proposes a flexible community space for a wide range of activities and a shared residents' administrative base. One suggestion is that this could be at the Tate building which might be enhanced by a car free public square on the south side. Consideration is also given to the still unsatisfactory Station to Tate route along Union and Great Suffolk Streets.

The focus is on the 'Bankside Triangle' bounded by Blackfriars Road and Borough High Street with a strong

recommendation for an integrated approach to the development of green and open spaces and the needs of local communities being met by business and tourism development.

Southwark Council Leader Stephanie Elsy, who wants north Southwark to be a

place to live, work and relax, says: "The Tate has successfully demonstrated that it is possible to work in partnership with local communities. The Council will expect nothing less from those who now invest or plan to invest in Bankside."

A public consultation is due to take place later this year.

• In its first year Tate Modern has brought 5.25 visitors to Bankside making it the world's most popular modern art museum. It is also Britain's third most popular attraction with more visitors than St Paul's Cathedral opposite. 1.5 million postcards have been sold and 850,000 cups of tea and coffee served. 29% of visitors came from overseas and 37% came from London.

Elephant regeneration plans agreed

THE PLANS for a £1.5 billion regeneration of Elephant and Castle have now been agreed. Later this year there will be a full development agreement between Southwark Council and Southwark Land Regeneration. A planning application will be made next spring.

Nicholas Taylor, director of SLR, says: "We are looking forward to working with the council and the community to deliver the next stage of this major project with an early priority on housing and the masterplan."

A new transport interchange will be built alongside a radical re-working of the local road network. The proposals cover 170 acres and include many new and improved homes including a substantial number of affordable houses and flats for sale or rent. The scheme is expected to support schools, local enterprise, community safety and provide new leisure facilities. The developers claim that regeneration will bring thousands of new jobs to the area.

SE1 councillor is new mayor

HILARY WINES, Councillor for the Bankside area, is the new Mayor of Southwark. The surprise appointment was made last month giving the former Liberal Democrat Leader of the Opposition little notice of taking up the office. Among her first duties will be to announce the General Election result for the London borough's three parliamentary constituencies. Hilary Wines has been councillor for 15 years in Cathedral Ward. At her instigation this will be renamed *Cathedrals* Ward next as it is the only one in England to have two cathedrals within its boundary.

TATE NEIGHBOUR

Plans for a 26 storey residential tower block are expected to be announced for the Mussett paper merchant site alongside Tate Modern. At very short notice Mussett's staff spent the Spring Bank Holiday weekend packing up to move across the river. The existing brick building is a former stables and wheelwrights built in 1867.

NO BURGERS

There has been an overwhelming rejection by residents to any idea of trading being allowed on the riverside. The public consultation found 100% opposition to any hot dog or ice cream vans being licensed. Tate Modern is investing £50,000 in opening a temporary refreshment outlet on its forecourt later this month to meet visitor demand.

TUTU VISIT

Archbishop Desmond Tutu was the surprise Sunday morning preacher at Southwark Cathedral at the end of last month. He was visiting London to join in the South African cultural festival which included events at Coin Street. At the cathedral the Archbishop was shown the room named in his honour last month by former Preseident Nelson Mandela.

ELECTION NEWS

Prime Minister Tony Blair launched the general election campaign in SE1's marginal Southwark constituency. Meanwhile the Fair Votes Campaign based in Chancel Street is looking ahead by winning support from leading figures in all three main parties for a change in the voting system for the next General Election expected in 2005.

The Story of Bankside

THE STORY of *Bankside: From the River Thames to St George's Circus* by Len Reilly and Geoff Marshall (Southwark Leisure, £4) reminds us that Tate Modern stands in the former Bishop of Winchester's estate. Names such as Park Street recall the nearby countryside; the street pattern still shows signs of old field boundaries. The other big estate was the Paris Garden where Christ Church was built in soil so damp that the building sank. In this very readable book the author does not hesitate to explode myths perpetuated by tourist guides; he firmly states that the Bishops of Winchester did not run the famous brothels and Sir Christopher Wren did not live here even if a plaque loved by visitors claims that he did. In the 19th century glass pavement lights for cellars were invented in Union street. The book is on sale at the Southwark Cathedral shop and John Harvard Library.

**King Lear at the
Globe**

'DO NOT be old before you are wise': this monumental play about loss, first staged in 1605, asks the question: what are man's needs and how shall he first understand them? So begins a headlong journey, unportended by any star. At a hasty three hours, Barry Kyle's production uncovers a distinctly Elizabethan dynamic; rough-shod and jolting to sensibilities, as the Fool follows Lear, on understudying a hopeless course of events. Laughter comes in surprising places; even with the end's most sombre answer. The tradition of oral storytelling, natural to the Globe, has turned audience to players, exposing a freer field of pity.

Luis Barragán at Design Museum

THE QUEST to shape nature and art to some native union is dazzlingly achieved in frames of hypnotic stillness and surprise. Fierce Mexican light is first barricaded out with Cubist self-discipline; startling colours and angles fold you in their walls then spring fresh spaces, horizons, and sun-corralling waterfalls. 'Life without beauty is not worthy of being called human' is a sentiment inevitably disclosing the elitism of Barragán's privileged background: his park drinking trough with its immense aisle of dark water finds its dedication in the tranquillity of slow-sipping horses, patrician emblem of some older order. The Architect's ego, however, exists to exalt: don't miss experiencing this one.
