“Like a spike through the heart”

LIKE A spike through the heart” is how English Heritage describes the impact of the proposed London Bridge Tower on the Tower of London World Heritage Site. “It would have a major detrimental impact and be wholly inappropriate and unsympathetic to the character of Southwark and two protected strategic views of St Paul’s” says English Heritage.

The proposed 306 metre high London Bridge Tower in the station forecourt would be the tallest building in Europe. The English Heritage commissioners take the view that, while the building is potentially of the highest quality, the tower would detract severely from the character of Southwark and protected views of St Paul’s Cathedral.

English Heritage also consider that the scheme fails to provide a comprehensive masterplan for the integration of the new building with the wider re-development of London Bridge Station and Borough Market. “A building of the size of London Bridge Tower would put considerable

additional stress on the already overloaded capacity of the transport infrastructure” added English Heritage.

This month the plans go on show for the first time at Hay’s Galleria when developer Sellar Property Group will be stressing claims that tower is environmentally friendly. Chief Executive Irvine Sellar says: “London Bridge Tower is architecture of world class quality and I believe the scheme will spectacularly enhance London’s skyline and boost regeneration of the surrounding area.”

However, a MORI poll commissioned by English Heritage has found that 62% of those questioned “do not want any more very tall buildings in London”. 91% approve protecting the views of St Paul’s. 67% think it is very important that a new building should fit in with its surrounding area.

...and a second tower may blight Bankside

THERE IS growing opposition to a proposed 32 storey tower next to Tate Modern.

The site is the boarded up Mussett building, a Victorian stables, in Hopton Street. Residents were summoned at very short notice to a display of the plans. During the hastily arranged consultation, held in the nearby Globe the day after the General Election, visitors complained that there was no literature to take away and a lack of information.

Concerned residents have formed a protest group called Bankside Residents Against Tate Tower which is already being called BRATT. Most members live either in riverside Falcon Point flats or Bankside Lofts where there are concerns about loss of views which attracted recent buyers.

“The development is totally wrong for the area” says BRATT spokesperson Theresa Towle. “It is right on top of the Tate itself and would ruin the effect of the present buildings around the Tate entrance.”

It is understood that Tate Modern is likely to object when the scheme is submitted to Southwark Council in the autumn.

GLA headquarters nears completion

THE NEW Greater London Authority headquarters next to Potters Fields is due to be topped out this month. The event, on Tuesday morning 3 July, will mark the completion of the steel structure in the distinctive light bulb shape. Construction remains on schedule with the Mayor and GLA expected to move in in exactly one year's time on the second birthday of London's new government. Also due to be present at the topping out ceremony are the building's architect Lord Foster, Mayor of London Ken Livingstone and minister for London Nick Raynsford.

Progress on new library for Waterloo

THE MOBILE library visiting Baylis Road has attracted an even higher number of users than the old library building in Lower Marsh. Cllr Leslie Boodram, who has been involved in moves to secure a replacement library, has announced that a temporary library building will be opened on the Lower Marsh site shortly.

Community Board elected in Waterloo

VOTING HAS taken place for members of the Waterloo Community Board and the names of the nine residents elected were due to be announced as we went to press. A polling station was at the Royal Festival Hall. A co-ordinator is being appointed to help with administration of the Waterloo SRB which will bring investment to the area.

Estate residents' vigil at Lambeth Palace

150 RESIDENTS from the Church Commissioners' Waterloo estate gathered outside Lambeth Palace on St Alban's Day night to highlight concerns about planned high rent properties. Enduring the windy night, which put out many of the candles, were many elderly and long-standing residents with their families. This month a party from Waterloo will lobby General Synod members in York.

SE1 Snippets



GAMBIA STREET GARDEN

The northern section of Gambia Street, joining Dolben Street, has been closed as part of the new traffic management scheme. Eventually the space between Scoresby and Dolben Streets will become a garden. The green buffer is needed to prevent east bound traffic in Union Street turning into the residential area when reaching the new one-way system.

DOLPHIN CONCERN

An 8ft long dolphin has been spotted in the Thames opposite Tate Modern. The river police were hoping it would find its own way back downstream to the North Sea. "Unfortunately they usually die", said a police spokesperson. "There's not a lot we can do with them." However, the presence of the dolphin indicates that the river's fish supplies are growing.

COLIN SLEE OBE

Dean of Southwark Colin Slee has been awarded the OBE for services to the community. Dean Slee, who came to Southwark in 1994 and has overseen huge changes at the cathedral, said: "I see it as a recognition of the dedication and skill of the many people who staff the areas of work I am involved in. All of it is a team effort."

ST ANDREW'S SHORT STREET

St Andrew's Church in Short Street, off The Cut, is to be demolished to make way for flats if plans are approved. The five storey building will have 14 self-contained flats with a business on the ground floor and a chapel. The present church replaced the original St Andrew's at the north end of Windmill Walk which was bombed in the Second World War.

**Macbeth at
the Globe**

TO BETRAY your king, and kinsman and to usurp the throne is the story of Macbeth, the Scottish play, a Shakespeare tragedy and one of the current productions in the Globe's Celtic Season. This contemporary rendering begins with a jazz score. All actors, including the three Weird Sisters are elegantly attired in dinner jackets. More comedy than tragedy, this production slips along easily and is enjoyable. It suffers from the lack of intensity when showing tragedy and is weak in its portrayal of tyranny, murder and the supernatural. The absence of blood may disappoint some but this modern comic interpretation is satisfying and worth watching for it newness.

**Giorgio Morandi
at Tate Modern**

THE MUTED still-lives of Giorgio Morandi speak of some private drama and the deliberations may not be noticed by us; at least, not at first. One is bound to wonder whether his soldier's breakdown in the First World War did not force the questioning of an objective reality ('nothing more surreal') when only the futility of individual action can have seemed certain. Boxes, bowls, bottles, primed of their identities, regroup compulsively as the known table top threatens a yawning edge and the horizon fluctuates alarmingly like some engulfing flood. Claiming 'real art' out of 'abstract reality' emerges almost as a process of surrender and recovery; one hopes the living became easier too.
