Made in Southwark

BANKSIDE IS to be a hub of activity during this month's three week *Made in Southwark* promotion presented by Southwark Festival.

Art Places, designed to uncover many hidden talents within Bankside, has brought together businesses, Borough-based organisations and artists to showcase the work of the vibrant artistic community. Venues in Borough High Street include the Slug & Lettuce, Stirling Ackroyd, Quinlan's Opticians, HSBC, John Harvard Library, Carducci Shoes and nearby Simply Nico. Also joining in are Feng Sushi in Borough Market, Southwark Cathedral,

the Union Theatre and Southwark Playhouse. Restaurants include Champor Champor in Weston Street. Architects Dinwiddie MacLaren in Snowsfields are also joining in along with PricewaterhouseCoopers.

Artist and curator Mark Haywood is opening his Bermondsey home for an exhibition of work by internationally known artists who have a connection with Southwark. Visitors will also be able to enjoy the panoramic view across the Festival area from his high level home windows. Meanwhile Tate Modern is promoting a range of gifts and cakes made in Southwark.

A special theme this year is the series of walks highlighting the heritage of Borough and Bankside. Author and historian John Constable will be conducting an evening tour based on the *Southwark Mysteries* and actors in Chaucer costume will be walking the start of the original pilgrim route to Canterbury before a special show at Southwark Playhouse.

••• How SE1 responded to the events of 11 September

US attacks bring concern about SE1 skyscrapers

WIDESPREAD CONCERN about erecting new high buildings has been expressed along Bankside following the attack on New York's World Trade Centre.

English Heritage Commissioner and architectural writer Simon Jenkins says: "It is clearly madness now to be erecting icon towers so lightweight as to be impossible to evacuate at speed." He also describes the planned London Bridge Tower, which would be Europe's tallest building, as "most lethal in an accident".

Southwark Council is currently considering an application for a 32

storey riverside tower which would dwarf Tate Modern. Bankside Residents for Appropriate Development (BROAD) has been formed to campaign against the proposed tower and in favour of appropriate development.

Meanwhile a 28 storey tower is also proposed upstream on the Albert Embankment.

The morning after the outrage there was a strong police presence on the riverside at Tate Modern. The gallery's Surrealism exhibition has opened with several key items still in America due to transatlantic transport difficulties.

As a precaution the London Eye was halted and evacuated soon after news of the American disaster was received.

Later in the week many people gathered in Southwark Cathedral to observe the three minute silence and at lunchtime on the same day extra seating had to be brought out for the memorial service. Among those attending were bank employees whose colleagues were missing in New York.

Actress Linda Powell, daughter of US secretary of State Colin Powell, has pulled out of the National Theatre production of Jitney set in America.

TATE MODERN Director Sir Nicholas Serota and his colleagues were shocked by the sudden death last month of sculptor Juan Muñoz at the age of 48. He suffered a stomach haemorrhage while on holiday in Ibiza.

At the time of his death his controversial Double Bind installation was in the Turbine Hall at Tate Modern. The installation's elevators were stopped in memory of the man who had filled the space with the extraordinary multi-layered construction. Double Bind will remain in place until March next year.

book review

Mind the Gap by Simon James

SIMON JAMES' book Mind the Gap (HarperCollins £14.99) is being launched this month at SE1's Tom Blau gallery where there is an exhibition of the author's photographs. He has been to the end of every line on the Underground. Some are deep in the countryside and even outside the Greater London. He has included the recently closed far east end of the Central Line where the track became a single line and ran into buffers under rhododrendrons at Ongar. But one line ends in SE1. The end - or beginning-of the Bakerloo Line is at the Elephant & Castle so the author found himself taking pictures in SE1. There is a fine photograph of the oxblood tiled station frontage in London Road where, we are told, a baby was born in a carriage and called Thelma Ursula Beatrice Eleanor - note the initials.

The Golden Hinde may look out of place in St Mary Overie Dock against the modern buildings but it is an authentic replica of Drake's 16th-century ship. The 11-strong crew who sailed across the Atlantic in 1991 have just held a reunion on board. None of them has any desire to repeat the voyage which saw food stocks run low and water seep through the hull.

Mother Clap's **Molly House**

SET IN the 18th and 21st century we are drawn into the world of transvestites and rent boys and shown murky relationships between lust and commerce. The death of Mrs Tull's husband catapults her and her wondering apprentice into new money making avenues. She embarks on opening a Molly house (brothel) and switches to renting dresses to men instead of women. This lewd and bawdy black comedy is irreverent and sharp in its utilization of candid and witty dialogue. The set is particularly fine as is the score and superb acting. Although the two periods are disjointed and do not work very well the humour is fresh and electrifying. Provocative dialogue and scenes show a secret London. See listing on this page.

My favourite, a modern 'chandelier' of letters in different languages costs £550. A Murano glass lamp is £220. Ordinary mortals will have to stick with downlights from £5 each or take out an overdraft. James also does lighting for private customers and commercial firms. The latter include the Tate and Benbow House flats opposite the Globe. A former resident of Lambeth, James likes the local area because it is "central, near a river and at a crossroads". It suits his shop as well.

Katherina Fritsch at **Tate Modern**

KATHARINA FRITSCH has opened at Tate Modern. Fables unleash all sorts of mischief. From a world of myth and imagination. figments are fixed in solid form and a ludicrous sort of sculptural reality begins to build. Our nightmare of identity as being random as conception is confirmed when a trestle table unzips 32 identical brethren. Fritsch calls the bluff of THAT THING on the tendrils of fear itself: a ghost, a pool of blood; three figures here to save or ruin us. A huge black mouse sits over his human - drenched white in bed and pinned further by his tidy duvet. Here's the mortality of half a lifetime's withdrawal into the sleep of dreams!

Childhood First Challenge

The trek can be an excellent form of team-building for a corporate group or equally a great way to meet new friends if you come alone. Many lasting friendships were forged on a past Challenge event and one wedding followed.
