# SE1's Riverside bus launches

A NEW bus route using the latest low emission vehicles start is now operating in SE1.

Riverside 1, which is being called route RV1, runs as near the Thames riverside as possible between Tower Bridge and County Hall. The turning points at each end are Covent Garden and the Tower of London.

Mayor of London Ken Livingstone, launching the new service in front of Tate Modern, who claimed that the RV1 was the first new bus route in London for over a decade.

Among present to welcome the new service was Shakespeare's Globe artistic director Mark Rylance who believes that the new service "will be great for tourists, for business and the community".

artistic director Mark Rylance who believes that the new service "will be great for tourists, for business and the community".

The project, whose working title was Ecobus, has been led by the South Bank Employers' Group. Sponsors include the Royal National Theatre, Shakespeare's Globe, LWT and Coin Street Community Builders.

The single-deck red buses, featuring local landmark and sponsor logos, have been built in Germany by Mercedes-Benz. On board flat-screen information screens show passengers where they are with a picture of the next stop. The buses will run every 10 minutes from early morning until midnight every day.

The service starts daily at 6am with the ten minute frequency operating from 7am daily except Sunday when the frequency starts at 8am.

There are bus stops in the South Bank, Bankside and Hay's Wharf streets including Upper Ground, Broadwall, Stamford Street, Sumner Street and Southwark Street. The service is part of the London Buses network with Travelcards and Saver tickets accepted.

•The route is already been shortlisted for a trial run of a new nil pollution bus which is being tested in major European cities.

## SE1's Resonance FM goes on air this month

A NEW radio station called Resonance FM is broadcasting daily starting this month from Guy's Tower in SE1.

London Musicians' Collective has been granted an Access Radio Pilot Licence to broadcast for 12 months. The station claims to be the only such arts-based project in the country describing itself as "a virtual arts centre whose location is at once local, global and timeless".

Broadcasters during May

will include Jarvis Cocker and Bermondsey-based saxophonist Caroline Kraabel. Regular programmes include the Local Heroes on Thursdays at 6pm.

Resonance can be heard on 104.4FM from 5pm till 1am on weekdays and from 12 noon till 1am at weekends. 24 hour broadcasting is planned for later in the year. The transmission radius is five kilometres.

## Aga Khan in row with St Thomas' Hospital over cultural centre plan

CONSULTANTS AT St Thomas' are preparing to chain themselves to railings if the southern end of the hospital site is sold to the Aga Khan.

The triangle of land is opposite Lambeth Palace and used to be part of the hospital but due to a complicated legal change in ownership the land is now under the control of King's College. One of the buildings is occupied by part of the medical school library.

The consultants are insisting that the site should

remain part of the NHS in order that the hospital can expand. However, the NHS trust can only afford to pay £12 to secure the site whilst the Aga Khan is offering £24m. He hopes to build an Islamic cultural centre to include a museum, library, university and an open space.

The Aga Khan's spokesman says that the plan would benefit the hospital with opportunities for collaboration on medical research.

### SE1 figures in guide to spiritual London

GEOFFREY CHAUCER, who claimed that English pilgrims always enjoyed themselves, is an inspiration for Robert Van de Weyer’s new book, *London: a guide to places of Spiritual interest* (O Books £5.99). He includes less well-known non-Christian sites such as the Temple of Mithras just across Southwark Bridge in Queen Victoria Street and the City’s unique Spanish and Portuguese Synagogue. Also here is St Magnus Church which once had the London Bridge pavement running under its tower porch. It is a landmark seen today below the monument when viewed from Hay’s Wharf and had strong links with nearby Billingsgate when fish was sold there. Guarding the south end of London Bridge is Southwark Cathedral where the author leads readers and walkers to the Shakespeare window and the Harvard Chapel. He could have added that there is also the Chaucer window.



### Waterloo's Millennium Green

WITH BUILDING sites scarring the local landscape at a truly alarming rate, it's heartening to hear of at least one project that is creating an harmonious environment for local people.

I'm talking about the popular Waterloo Millennium Green Project in Baylis Road.

There were problems with the water feature but work is now taking place so that it will be complete for all to enjoy by June. The level of the water has been reduced for safety purposes, and planting both in the water and alongside will create a wild stream effect. There will also be extra seating under the trees and planting by the waterfall.

Children's love of water has not been forgotten however and a special water play area will feature in the adjacent Adventure Playground to be supervised by workers from Blackfriars Settlement. There will also be a sandpit, tree walkway and small stage with speakers at the request of local young people.

Last but not least is the handsome Youth Centre building at the South end of the Green. A bouquet to the much-maligned Lambeth Council for creating an environmentally friendly public building. This has a grass roof for insulation, solar panels to reduce usage of electricity from the main grid; rain water will be recycled for use inside the building and a large area of glass makes maximum use of natural daylight.
