London's government returns south of the river



THE QUEEN is due in Southwark on Tuesday 23 July to open the Greater London Authority's new riverside City Hall building at Potters Field.

Architectural commentator Marcus Binney has already compared the controversial Norman Foster building with the Pompidou Centre in Paris and New York's Guggenheim Museum.

Less flattering descriptions liken the curving glass structure to an ashtray, a fencing mask and a car headlight. The 480 strong GLA staff is preparing to move from Westminster during the first three weeks of July.

After the official opening the public will be admitted on

weekdays to the café and, when not in use for functions, to a public viewing gallery. There is provision for up to 250 people to be able to watch the 25 GLA members meeting in session.

Outside, the large plaza is being planted with 30 foot trees brought from Germany and lit at night from a lighting tower.

The GLA has leased the specially designed £43m building until 2027. The opening of a special building for London's government comes 13 years after the Greater London Council, the GLA's predecessor based at County Hall, was abolished.

Baton relay to make early morning South Bank visit

THE QUEEN'S Jubilee Baton relay arrives in SE1 early on Sunday 14 July.

The Baton, which has been carried across Africa and New Zealand, contains the Queen's message to the Commonwealth Games opening in Manchester on 25 July.

Runners will bring the Baton over Westminster Bridge at 6.15am. The team is due to follow the South Bank riverside past County Hall and Jubilee Gardens. By 6.40am the Baton reaches Broadwall on the Lambeth boundary where it will be taken by vehicle convoy through Southwark to Tower Bridge.

Sensors inside the Baton monitor the runner's pulse rate conveying it into a blade of pulsating light.

One the runners is Topnotch Health Club founder Matthew Harris.

Two SE1 developments praised in RIBA awards

SOUTHWARK CATHEDRAL'S Millennium building is among the best new buildings of the year.

It is the only church in the list of 58 modern buildings and one of only two historic buildings in the list of Royal Institute of British Architects award winners. The accolade recognises high architectural standards and the building's contribution to the local environment.

Dean of Southwark Colin Slee says: "The Cathedral's buildings have been judged to be as outstanding as the Gateshead Millennium Bridge."

The Cathedral's new building is now eligible to be shortlisted for the RIBA Stirling Prize to be awarded in October.

Hopton's Almshouses celebrate anniversary

HOPTON'S ALMSHOUSES are 250 years old this year. The anniversary will be marked by a thanksgiving service at Christ Church.

The Hopton Street cottages were built in 1752 with money left by wealthy merchant Charles Hopton. He made his will just five days before his

death in 1730. The site was "the cheapest, best and most convenient piece of ground that could be had for the building". The nearest river crossing was London Bridge. Blackfriars Road and Southwark Street had yet to be laid out.

St Christopher House gets go-ahead

REDEVELOPMENT PLANS for the St Christopher House site approved by Southwark include a community centre space let to residents at a peppercorn rent.

The site, bounded by Southwark Street and Zoar and Sumner Streets, has been occupied by the Highways Agency and the Foreign Office.

During the three years construction period developer Land Securities is to employ a Community Liaison Officer. The buildings are expected to provide 6,419 new jobs.

It was also agreed that the health club would allow concessionary rates for residents using the facilities including a swimming pool.

Bridge 401 lights up Union Street

THERE WAS confusion in Union Street as Better Bankside guests gathered outside the Union Theatre to see a lightwork switched on.

The main lighting feature under the railway bridge, designed by Ron Haselden, displays its assigned number 401 with a mass of tiny lights on the brick roof.

Unfortunately when former Mayor Hilary Wines pressed the switch nothing happened. Indeed with the nearby traffic lights blank it was feared that the area's lights had fused.

However, as guests returned to Café Lounge for further drinks, emergency workers confirmed that there was a power failure.

40,000+ plus jobs for SE1 in Ken's plan

THE SE1 area is set to gain 43,200 new jobs and 5,200 homes by 2016 according to Ken Livingstone's London Plan document launched last month at Waterloo's IMAX Cinema.

The plan sees SE1 experiencing an intensification of development "to redress the perception of the zone's relative isolation from the rest of central London".

It also expects the Thameslink 2000 plan to be approved and looks to an increase in office development along Tooley Street in addition to the agreed plans for the More London site. London Bridge is earmarked for tall landmark buildings.

The Elephant & Castle is seen as "a suitable location to meet some of Central London's longer-term needs for extra office space".

Suggestions for Waterloo include a "capacity to serve as a complementary attraction to the West End".

The consultation ends period on 30 September and views can be sent to the new City Hall.



Harden's London Food Shops Guide

SE1 HAS 13 good food shops according to Harden's London Food Shops 2002/3 guide. Authors Richard and Peter suggest that historians may cite the emergence of Borough Market as the sea change in attitude to food. "Who, in the mid-1990s would have thought that Londoners could regard trekking across town to seek out fresh and sometimes exotic fare as the basis for a regular Saturday morning excursion?" they ask. Coopers, which was already in Lower Marsh in the 1980s, is praised as a "well-stocked" health food shop with "divine" scones in its café. Absolutely Starving by Hay's Galleria has "great brownies". But Fish! Shop in Cathedral Street is described as "good quality but expensive". A useful book for finding food shops in the City.

Changing name and sex she enters the service of Duke Orsino who she secretly desires. Whilst on an errand for the Duke, delivering a love letter to the Countess Viola, she becomes horrified to find that Viola has fallen madly in love with her. The Director is Tim Carroll who gave us a modern jazzy version of Macbeth last year. Costumes, comedy and fine acting especially from Michael Brown (Viola) and Mark Rylance (Olivia), combine to produce a feast of Shakespearian drama at its finest.



Dog mess problem & organic food

PETS ARE an important part of our lives, but there can be a down side. Health hazards from dog faeces in local parks and streets is one of them. Now Bankside Open Spaces Trust has launched an innovative scheme to help with the problem. Leaflets on responsible dog ownership are to be distributed locally and a dog show is planned as part of a big 'Southwark-by-the-Sea Day' at Mint Street Park on Saturday 3 August.

It is also hoped to have sponsored dog walk plus a dog training scheme through the Kennel Club later in the year. To quote Adele Morris, Bankside Open Spaces Trust Community Development Worker: "We don't hate your dogs we love your dogs. We just don't like dog mess." She points out that all sections of the community use local parks and the needs of non dog owners should be respected. Local school children have produced the witty illustrations for the Bankside Open Spaces Trust (BOST) dog leaflet.

Green Ventures is a community organic box scheme in Southwark who deliver in SE1. In the summer some of the produce comes from greenhouses in Brockwell Park, Lambeth. Prices are on a sliding scale so that people on low incomes can enjoy organic fruit and veg. The scheme is non profit-making and deliveries are by bicycle and trailer or you can collect. This scheme sounds just too good to miss.
