Southwark Cathedral celebrates 100th birthday

Sunday 3 July is Southwark Cathedral's 100th birthday which will be celebrated all day indoors and outdoors.

It will be exactly a hundred years to the day since Edward VII and Queen Alexandra came to Southwark's ancient priory church to witness it becoming the new Diocese of Southwark's cathedral.



The party begins at 12.30pm following the Sunday morning Choral Eucharist which will be broadcast on giant outdoor screens.

Activities include face painting and circus acts. Borough Market's stallholders will be selling food and there will be a Victorian merry-go-round and a jazz band.

Guests include 9 'Pearlies' with a notable rare appearance by Southwark's Pearly King and Queen in costume.

At 3pm the Centenary Service of Celebration, sung by the Great Choir of Southwark, the winning entry of the Centenary Music Composition Competition will have its first liturgical performance.

Afterwards a hundred white doves are due to be released from the south courtyard to represent the next 100 years of the Diocese.

The day concludes at 6.30pm with a Solemn Eucharist sung by the girls and men of the Cathedral Choir.

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

Festival Hall closes its doors

The Royal Festival Hall is closing this month for refurbishment.

The final classical concert for 2005 was held last month and the Poetry Library books are going into storage. A number of sstaff are being made redundant. The 54 year old RFH is due to reopen in 2007.

The Queen Elizabeth Hall, Purcell Room and Hayward Gallery will all offer full programmes during the closure. Meanwhile preparations are being made for Foyles bookshop to open on the ground floor riverfront on Tuesday 5 July. The new shop will stock around 30,000 books ranging from fiction to children's but also reflecting the South Bank's music, arts and literature programmes.

New restaurants coming to the South Bank Centre include Wagamama, Strada and Giraffe.

Borough and Barcelona twinned Borough Market has twinned with La Boqueria market in Barcelona.

Manuel Ripoll, president of La Boqueria, announced the twinning at the "Making Markets: Creating Places" conference at Glaziers' Hall. The plan is to share best practice and hold exchange visits in which stallholders offer English and Spanish delicacies in both markets.

La Boqueria is a colourful covered market dating from the 13th century and operating six days a week in the heart of Barcelona.

Southwark is already twinned with Langenhagen in Germany and Clichy in Paris. Southwark Cathedral is twinned with Bergen in Norway and Rouen in France.

Stars 'top out' the new Young Vic

The Young Vic's new building has been 'topped out' by Helen McCrory and appeal patron Jude Law.

The ceremony marked the new theatre in The Cut reaching its full height, with completion expected in Autumn 2006.

"It's a thrilling moment for us and for British theatre," said artistic director David Lan. "It means that the world-renowned Young Vic auditorium and company are not just of the past and of the present but of the future."

A £500,000 grant just received from the London Development Agency leaves the campaign with only £600,000 left to raise.

In the meantime the Young Vic Company continues its 'Walkabout' programme, including a residency at the Barbican Centre.

The open front of Monmouth Coffee House is perfect on a sunny summer morning for those wanting breakfast.

The coffee house, opposite the Floral Hall in Borough Market, has a long wooden communal table with French bread, butter and jams. The choice includes blackberry, rasbberry delight, Victoria plum and London Marmalade which tastes homemade. There is also Marmite.

At the back is another long bench piled with a choice of croissants, pains au chocolate, scones and Danish pastries baked by Villandry.

A cappucino with bread, butter and jam costs £4.50. Unusually, the huge bowl of sugar contains only brown.

The warm mornings also offer the chance to sit outside.

Like the original Monmouth Street shop, opened in Covent Garden in 1978, the Borough Market branch sells Monmouth coffee beans.

It is good to find Waterloo, South Bank and Borough listed under the Central London section. At last SE1 is recognised as being at the hub of the capital.

Sadly the map is misleading. Bankside Restaurant is rightly praised for its "huge soup" but the front door is marked as being some way from Sumner Street. The new Ev is placed in Ufford Street on the site of demolished St Andrew's rather than off Hatfields. Masters Super Fish is

marked in the location of the unlisted Waterloo Bar & Kitchen

Mar i Terra is in its correct position by the Gambia Street Garden but it's a pity that the well-established Blackfriars Wine Bar opposite, and now serving evening meals, is not mentioned. Also omitted is the French Maison Brillant cafe in Gabriel's Wharf.

Anyone looking for the Konditor & Cook cafe in The Cut will be disappointed -it closed last year for the Young Vic rebuilding.

But there are pleasant surprises. Baltic in Blackfriars Road does lunch for £11.50.
