St George's Day in SE1

Sunday 23 April promises to be a busy day of local events, with celebrations of England's patron saint, the nation's greatest playwright and London's top athletes.

This year you can go on a Dragon Quest around the streets of the Borough as part of Mental Fight Club's St George and the Dragon weekend.

In the afternoon Dr Sam Riches, author of *St George – Hero, Martyr, Myth*, will explore the rich St George heritage with an illustrated talk hosted by the Club in Guy's Chapel.

The chapel is currently the temporary home for the congregation of Southwark's St George the Martyr Church during its major restoration programme.

At St George's Roman Catholic Cathedral Mass for St George's Day will be celebrated on Wednesday 26 April at 12.30pm. The cathedral has care of a St George relic.

Meanwhile City Hall will be open to the public on Sunday offering views of Marathon runners crossing Tower Bridge.

Shakespeare's Birthday

The Mayor of London is once again backing a day of free events at Shakespeare's Globe on Sunday 23 April as a joint celebration of St George and Shakespeare's Birthday.

Roman soldiers and a band will be outside at 10.15am to welcome Cleopatra who is arriving by water. She will sail downstream on a boat with handmaidens and oarsmen in costume. A second boat will be rowed closely behind carrying musicians providing accompaniment throughout the journey. Cleopatra's boat is the *Jubilant* replica seen on the river during last year's re-enactment of Nelson's funeral procession.

The free entry day at the Globe will have a Warriors and Queens theme and feature Roman side-shows and workshops. Visitors will be able to deliver a line or two from the famous stage.

Round the corner on Park Street the Rose Theatre site will be open to the public to celebrate the Bard's birthday and the blue plaque unveiled in January by Sir Ian McKellen.


Somewhere in the skyline the London Eye has hidden a giant Easter egg. Visitors who spot it will be entered into a draw to win a holiday.



Waterloo gains a new theatre this month with the opening of the Bookshop Theatre behind the Calder Bookshop on The Cut. The brainchild of John Calder, Samuel Beckett's principal publisher, it is home to the Godot Company.

The Godot Company is based on a core of veteran actors who combine active careers on stage, screen and in broadcasting with a long-term commitment to sustained rehearsal and performance of the works of Samuel Beckett. Each actor can perform several roles and therefore replace another member of the cast as and when necessary.

To celebrate the centenary of Beckett's birth, the company is performing six of his shorter works in the six months between April and September.

This month's Thursday talks and readings at the Calder Bookshop also reflect the Beckett centenary theme.

As part of the Beckett Centenary Festival at the Barbican, American artist Jenny Holzer presents a series of light projections on the Barbican and buildings around London including City Hall. Writings from Beckett and a selection of works by celebrated poets are cast onto well-known London landmarks, allowing light and text to flow over the cityscape, creating an extraordinary visual experience. City Hall will be illuminated on Friday 7 April.

EXHIBITION REVIEW

Designer of the Year

An exhibition at the Design Museum allows you to have your say on who should win the coveted £25,000 Designer of the Year prize.

A room is dedicated to each of the four nominees – the design team of *The Guardian*, Jamie Hewlett (creative director of virtual band Gorillaz), furniture designer Tom Dixon and humanitarian designer Cameron Sinclair.

The first room is devoted to *The Guardian*, and it's the room where there is the most to see. Typographical anoraks will appreciate the display devoted to the development of the paper's custom typefaces, Guardian Egyptian and Guardian Sans.

Early dummies of a tabloid *Guardian* (2003) and the first Berliner experiments (2004) provide a fascinating glimpse into the long process of research and testing that led up to the launch of the redesigned Berliner-size *Guardian* in September 2005.

Seen alongside today's paper the 1998 redesign, with its iconic masthead by David Hillman, deemed revolutionary at the time, looks incredibly dated.

If you can drag yourself away from the *Guardian* display, the next room is full of the furniture of Tom Dixon, including 2005 work for Artek and Habitat. The chalk-and-cheese contrast between a newspaper design and product design is both a delight and a frustration for the visitor.

A side room is devoted to Cameron Sinclair, whose Architecture

for Humanity practice has constructed - to sustainable designs - schools, clinics and community centres in the areas affected by the tsunami of December 2004. As Sinclair's work doesn't lend itself to display in a gallery, a series of monitors shows images of his construction projects, linked to models mounted on the wall.

The Gorillaz phenomenon may have passed you by, but this exhibition provides ample opportunity to immerse yourself in the artwork and promotional material for the virtual band founded in 1999 by Jamie Hewlett and Damon Albarn.

A final room provides iMacs for visitors to browse the Designer of the Year website. Cards are available for members of the public to cast their vote for the £25,000 prize and leave their comments; these can be left on a ledge around the edge of the room for others to read.

The public vote will be taken into account by the four jurors: Christopher Bailey of Burberry, Emily Campbell from the British Council, last year's winner Hilary Cottam and TV presenter Kevin McCloud. The chair of the jury is Christopher Frayling, rector of the Royal College of Art.

• The winner will be announced on 22 May and the exhibition continues until 18 June.
